



Analysis of Funds Received By Political Parties During Election Period Analysis of 31 Elections held between 2008 and 2012

Political parties are required to submit a statement of election expenditure to the Election Commission containing details of the total amount received as funds in the form of cash, cheques and Demand Drafts among other details. Political parties submit these statements providing information of funds colleced from the date of announcement of elections to the date of completion of elections, which could be between 3 weeks and 3 months based on the notification issued by the Election Commission. This report analyses the funds received by the national parties, at the state units as well as from the central headquarters of the party, during election periods. A total of 31 elections including various state assembly elections and Lok Sabha election of 2009 have been analysed.

Summary of Highlights

Total Income from Funds Received

- The total funds received by the 6 national parties at the party headquarters and at the state units during election period: Rs 2545.36 crores
- The total amount of funds received by the 6 national parties at the party headquarters is Rs 967.41 crores
- The total amount of funds received by the 6 national parties at the state unit level is Rs 1,577.95 crores
- The total funds of Rs 2545.36 crores at the central and state level was received within an average of 115 days from date of announcement of elections to the date of completion of elections

Funds received at the party headquarters

- INC has not declared its income from funds received at the party headquarters for 14 elections out of 31 analysed, including the Lok Sabha Elections. The party's funds declared at the party headquarters is Rs 278.77 crores (between 2008 and 2012)
- BSP has declared the maximum funds received during election period between 2008 and 2012: Rs 330.36 crores
- The total funds received by **BJP** at the central (headquarters) level between 2008 and 2012 during election period is **Rs 326.20crores** within an average of 115 days from date of announcement to completion of elections
- CPI has declared the least funds received during election period: Rs 5 crores and CPM Rs 9.26 crores

Funds received at the state unit

- INC received the maximum funds of Rs 754.72 crores within an average of 115 days (from date of announcement of elections to the date of completion of elections)
- The **total income of BJP** from funds received at the state unit during the elections was **Rs 445.39 crores** where the party has declared the maximum income from the elections held in **2009** (**Rs 169.56 crores**) within 144 days and the minimum income from the Bihar Assembly Elections held in **2010** (**Rs 5.2 crores**) within 80 days
- BSP's total funds received during elections in 2008 to 2012 amounted to Rs 330.36 crores: Maximum funds: Rs 127.60 crores during 2008 elections (10 elections) and minimum funds: Rs 33.46 crores during 2009 elections (Lok Sabha and 7 Assembly Elections)





Lok Sabha Elections, 2009: Funds collected in 88 days

- Party Headquarters:
 - INC is the only party which has not declared the party's funds received at the party headquarters during the Lok Sabha Elections
 - BJP declared the maximum funds received at the party headquarters for the Lok Sabha elections along with Sikkim, Orissa and Andhra Pradesh elections: Rs 163.03 crores
 - CPI declared the least funds received at the party headquarters for the Lok Sabha elections: Rs 0.06 crores (Rs 6 lakhs)
- State Units:
 - INC had received the maximum amount (Rs 313.74 crores) from funds in cash and cheque during the General Elections of 2009 while CPI had received the least (Rs 0.06 crores) as funds
 - While BJP has declared a combined funds of Rs 315.57 crores received as funds during the General Elections and Assembly Elections to Orissa, Sikkim and Andhra Pradesh, all the other parties have declared receiving varying amounts for different elections

<u>Description of Funds received by political parties at Party headquarters during elections by National</u> Parties

- While analysing the statements submitted by the parties between 2008 and 2012, it is seen that maximum funds received was by cash while collection by cheques/DD come a distant second
- 90.38% of the total funds received by INC at the party headquarters between 2008 and 2012 was **by cash (Rs 251.96 crores)** while only 9.62% of the funds was by **cheque (Rs 26.81 crores)**
- 67.18% of the total funds received by BJP was by cash (Rs 219.11 crores) while only 24.8% of the funds received was by cheque/DD (Rs 80.89 crores)
- 83.78% of NCP's total funds was by cash (Rs 14.93 crores) and a meager 16.22% by cheque/DD (Rs 2.89 crores)
- BSP is the only national party which has **declared funds received from sale of properties** during elections which constituted 4.47% of the party's collection during elections (**Rs 14.76 crores**)
- A whopping 71.44% of the party's funds was in cash (Rs 236.01 crores) and 23.37% in cheque/DD (Rs 77.2 crores)

Funds Received By the National Parties at the Party headquarters

- Funds received by 6 national parties during Assembly Elections in 2008:
 - Total funds received by the national parties: Rs 356.45 crores
 - o Funds received in 116 days
 - o INC declared the maximum funds received **of Rs 186.91 crores**, at the party headquarters during the election period of 116 days
 - The second highest amount in funds received was declared by BSP Rs 127.60 crores followed by BJP Rs
 37.3 crores
- Funds received by 6 national parties during Elections in 2009
 - o Total funds received by the national parties: Rs 306.72 crores
 - o Funds received in 144 days

Lok Sabha Elections, 2009: Funds collected in 88 days

- INC is the only party which has not declared the party's funds received at the party headquarters during the Lok Sabha Elections
- BJP declared the maximum funds received at the party headquarters for the Lok Sabha elections along with Sikkim, Orissa and Andhra Pradesh elections: Rs 163.03 crores
- CPI declared the least funds received at the party headquarters for the Lok Sabha elections: Rs 0.06 crores (Rs 6 lakhs)





Assembly Elections in 2009: Funds received in 144 days

- CPM has not declared the funds received at the party headquarters for the assembly elections in Sikkim,
 Orissa and Andhra Pradesh
- Maximum funds was declared by INC for the Assembly Elections in Jharkhand (Rs 43.51 crores) followed by assembly elections in Arunachal, Haryana and Maharashtra (Rs 34.96 crores)

Funds received by 6 national parties during Elections in 2010

- Total funds received by the national parties: Rs 57.20 crores
- o Funds received in 80 days
- INC has not declared its funds received at the party headquarters during the Bihar assembly elections in
 2010
- o Maximum funds received was declared by BSP (Rs 37.45 crores) followed by BJP (Rs 16.78 crores)

• Funds received by 6 national parties during Elections in 2011

- Total funds received by the national parties: Rs 90.88 crores
- Funds received in 81 days
- o INC and CPM have not declared the funds received at the party headquarters for the election period in 2011
- Maximum funds received was declared by BSP (Rs 48.68 crores) followed by BJP (Rs 37.99 crores)

• Funds received by 6 national parties during Elections in 2012

- Total funds received by the national parties: Rs 156.15 crores
- Funds received in 155 days
- o INC has not declared the funds received at the party headquarters for the election period in 2012
- BSP declared the maximum funds received at the party headquarters: Rs 83.17 crores followed by BJP: Rs
 64.56 crores

Description of Funds Received at the Party headquarters during elections between 2008 and 2012

- According to the proforma issued by the Election Commission of India to political parties for submission of their election expenditure statements, funds received between the date of announcements of elections and completion of elections have to be disclosed in cash, cheque/DD, in kind (value of which has to be specified)
- While analysing the statements submitted by the parties between 2008 and 2012, it is seen that maximum funds received was by cash while collection by cheques/DD come a distant second
- 90.38% of the total funds received by INC at the party headquarters between 2008 and 2012 was by cash (Rs 251.96 crores) while only 9.62% of the funds was by cheque (Rs 26.81 crores)
- 67.18% of the total funds received by BJP was by cash (Rs 219.11 crores) while only 24.8% of the funds received was by cheque/DD (Rs 80.89 crores)
- 83.78% of NCP's total funds was by cash (Rs 14.93 crores) and a meager 16.22% by cheque/DD (Rs 2.89 crores)
- BSP is the only national party which has **declared funds received from sale of properties** during elections which constituted 4.47% of the party's collection during elections (**Rs 14.76 crores**)
- A whopping 71.44% of the party's funds was in cash (Rs 236.01 crores) and 23.37% in cheque/DD (Rs 77.2 crores)

Funds Received By the National Parties at the State unit

Funds received by 6 national parties during Assembly Elections in 2008:

- o Total funds received by the national parties: Rs 324.55 crores
- o Funds received in 116 days
- o INC and BJP have given a combined statement of funds received for the Assembly Elections conducted in Rajasthan, MP, Chhattisgarh, Delhi, Mizoram and Jammu and Kashmir
- While the total funds received by INC during the election period was Rs 156.45 crores, total funds received by BJP was Rs 37.30 crores
- BSP did not contest in the Mizoram, Meghalaya, Tripura and Nagaland Assembly Elections and the total funds received from other elections was Rs 76.20 crores
- BSP declared the maximum funds during Karnataka Elections with Rs 51.40 crores followed by INC (Rs 12.72 crores) and BJP (Rs 4.21 crores)
- While <u>NCP has not submitted its election expenditure statements</u> for the Rajasthan, MP, Chhattisgarh, Delhi, Mizoram and Jammu & Kashmir elections, BJP has not submitted its statement of election expenditure for the Meghalaya, Tripura and Nagaland Assembly Elections

Funds received by the national parties during elections in 2009:

- Total funds received by the national parties: Rs 746.94 crores
- o Funds received in 144 days

Lok Sabha Elections in 2009: Funds received in 88 days

- o **INC had received the maximum amount** (Rs 313.74 crores) from funds in cash and cheque during the General Elections of 2009 while **CPI had received the least** (Rs 0.06 crores) as funds
- While BJP has declared a combined funds of Rs 315.57 crores received as funds during the General Elections and Assembly Elections to Orissa, Sikkim and Andhra Pradesh, all the other parties have declared receiving varying amounts for different elections

Assembly Elections in 2009: Funds received in 144 days

- While BJP had given a combined funds of Rs 315.57 crores for the Lok Sabha Elections and the Assembly Elections to Sikkim, Orissa and Andhra Pardesh, the party has not submitted its election expenditire report for the Arunachal Assembly Election
- Of the Assembly Elections in 2009, the <u>maximum funds received</u> was received by INC during Maharashtra elections (Rs 36.11 crores) followed by BSP which showed a combined funds received of Rs 33.16 crores during Orissa and Andhra Pradesh elections
- Least income from funds was declared by CPM (Rs 0.02 crores Haryana election and Rs 0.03 crores -Sikkim election) while CPI has not submitted its election expenditure statement for the Orissa and Andhra Pradesh Elections in 2009





Assembly Elections in 2010:

- Total funds received by the national parties: Rs 47.21 crores
- o Funds received in 80 days
- Bihar was the only state that went for election in 2010 and all the National Parties contested in the same.
 Maximum funds during the Bihar Elections was declared by BSP (Rs 37.45 crores) followed by BJP (Rs 5.20 crores) and INC (Rs 1.58 crores)

Assembly Elections in 2011

- o Total funds received by the national parties: Rs 168.91 crores
- Funds received in 81 days
- Tamil Nadu, Assam, Kerala, Puducherry and West Bengal went for elections in 2011 and the National parties contested in most of the elections
- INC showed the highest in funds received during 2011 Assembly Elections: Rs 62.60 crores. BJP showed a combined funds of Rs 38.00 crores from all the 5 states while BSP showed a combined funds of Rs 48.68 crores from all states the party contested from (BSP did not contest in Assam Assembly Elections)
- Out of the other parties, maximum income from funds was declared by INC (Rs 25.14 crores Kerala Election, Rs 16.58 crores from Assam election and Rs 10.90 crores from West Bengal election) while the lowest income from funds was declared by CPI (Rs 0.07 crores from Assam and Rs 0.08 crores from Puducherry elections)
- NCP did not contest in Tamil Nadu and Puducherry Assembly Elections conducted in 2011

Assembly Elections in 2012

- Total funds received by the national parties: Rs 290.34 crores
- o Funds received in 155 days
- Goa, Manipur, UP, Punjab, Uttrakhand, Gujarat and Himachal Pradesh went for elections in 2012 and the
 National Parties contested in most of the elections
- While BSP did not contest in Manipur elections, <u>NCP had declared that the party received no income from</u>
 funds during Punjab Assembly Election
- It should be noted that BJP received Rs 6.28 crores and INC, Rs 6.20 crores as funds during Goa election with a difference of only Rs 0.08 crore while BSP has delcared a total income from funds as Rs 6.17 crores (for Goa, UP, Punjab and Uttrakhand). Least funds during Goa elections was declared by CPM (Rs 3.23 crores)

Description of Funds Received During Elections between 2008 and 2012

- While analysing the statements submitted by the parties between 2008 and 2012, it is seen that maximum funds received was by cash while collection by cheques/DD come a distant second
- 62.58% of the total funds received by INC between 2008 and 2012 was by cash (Rs 472.34 crores) while only 37.42% of the funds was by cheque (Rs 282.38 crores)
- 45.75% of the total funds received by BJP was by cash (Rs 203.77 crores) while 50.25% of the funds received was by cheque/DD (Rs 223.80 crores)
- 68.00% of NCP's total funds was by cash (Rs 12.54 crores) and a meager 32% by cheque/DD (Rs 5.90 crores)
- BSP is the only national party which has **declared funds received from sale of properties** during elections which constituted 4.47% of the party's collection during elections (**Rs 14.76 crores**)
- A whopping 71.44% of the party's funds was in cash (Rs 236.01 crores) and 23.37% in cheque/DD (Rs 77.20 crores)
- CPI and CPM are the only two national parties whose funds were received more in cheque than in cash. CPI's income of Rs 5.60 crores (65.12% of the total funds received) was by cheque and Rs 3 crores (34.88% of total funds) in cash
