

Dear Friends,

Here is the information on candidates contesting Bellary bye -elections. 8 candidates are contesting for the Bellary constituency elections 2011. We have analysed the affidavits of all the candidates. The main points of the analysis are:

- 2 out of 8 candidates have criminal cases pending against them. B Sriramulu, an independent candidate, has 8 criminal cases pending against him while B Anjinappa, an independent candidate has 3 criminal cases pending against him.
- B Sriramulu has the highest assets recorded i.e. 40 crore followed by P Gadilingappa from the BJP who has assets worth Rs 28 crore.
