Gujarat Election Watch*

Lok Sabha elections 2009

Lok Sabha 2009 elections were held in a single phase in Gujarat on April 30, 2009. This chapter includes the analysis of voting trend, criminalization, money power, gender, etc in these elections. Information provided by ECI and details from the affidavits filed by the contesting candidates have been used for above analysis.

Growth of political parties

In Lok Sabha 2004, 14 parties contested elections which rose to 32 parties in Lok Sabha 2009 elections. This reflects a rise of 120 % in the number of parties from Lok Sabha 2004 elections to Lok Sabha 2009 elections.

Growth in number of candidates

In Lok Sabha 2004 Elections, the total number of candidates contesting elections for 26 seats in the State was 162, which rose to 359 in the 2009 elections. The state witnessed an increase in number of candidates by 197 or 122%.

Executive summary for candidates and MPs

Summary for candidates

- Affidavits of all 359 contesting elections were analysed by Gujarat Election Watch for Lok Sabha 2009 elections.
- Out of these 359 candidates, 69 candidates or 19.22% declared pending criminal cases against them. Out of the total 26 candidates of BJP, 11(42.31%) had pending criminal cases. 10 candidates of INC out of 26 (38.46%) and 24 of the 174 independent candidates had pending criminal cases against them.
- Out of these 69 candidates with pending criminal cases, 34 had pending serious criminal cases against them. BJP had 7 & INC had 5 candidates with pending serious criminal cases against them.
- There were 96 IPC charges of serious nature which included murder, kidnapping, theft, robbery, dacoity and financial crimes related to cheating and forgery.
- There were total 16 Red Alert constituencies where 3 or more contesting candidates had pending criminal cases against them. Junagadh had 6 candidates with pending criminal cases followed by Navsari with 5 candidates having pending criminal cases against them.
- A total of 47 candidates out of 359 i.e. 13.09 % were crorepatis.
- A total of 4 candidates declared zero assets.
- Among major parties, the average asset per candidate for INC was Rs. 2.27 crores, BJP was Rs 2.32 crores and BSP was 0.25 crores.

- 56.8% of candidates (204 of 359) had not furnished PAN card details.
- Number of women candidates was just 26 (7%) as compared to 333 of men (93%).
- About 32% candidates (115 of 359) were graduates & above.
- Total voting in the state was 47%. BJP secured 46.52 % of the total votes polled and INC got 43.38% of the votes polled.

Summary for MPs

- Out of 26 MPs, 11 (42.31%) have pending criminal cases against them. In 2004 Lok Sabha, only 6 MPs had pending criminal cases against them.
- Out of these 11 MPs with pending criminal cases, there are pending serious criminal cases against 7 (28%) MPs. Contrasting this with 2004 Lok Sabha, only 4 MPs had serious pending criminal cases.
- The number of crorepati MPs has increased from 6 in Lok Sabha 2004 to 12 in current Lok Sabha (increase by 100%).
- The number of MPs with pending criminal cases from Gujarat in Lok Sabha has increased from 6 to 11 (83%). The number of total pending criminal cases has increased by an alarming 338% from 8 to 35.
- All 26 MPs were either from BJP or INC. 15 candidates of BJP and 11 candidates of INC won.
- The average assets for MP in Lok Sabha 2009 of BJP were 2.61 crores and for MP of INC it was 1.36 crores.
- Average asset for a MP from Gujarat were Rs2.08 crores.
- Out of 26 women candidates, only 4 managed to win. Hence only 15% of MPs from Gujarat in current Lok Sabha are women.

Voting and winning trend

Voting analysis


Total voting in the state was 47%. BJP secured 46.52 % of the total votes polled and only 22.28% of the registered voters. INC managed to get 43.38% of the votes cast and 20.78% registered voters. About 90% of the votes cast went in favor of either BJP or INC. Other political parties and independent candidates did not receive a sizable amount of votes cast. The total electorate in Gujarat was 3,64,84,290 and the total votes cast were 1,74,72,825.

Figure: Per cent of votes cast in Gujarat: party-wise




Candidates vs MPs

Analysis based on pending criminal cases

Pending criminal cases- analysis for candidates

Total 359 affidavits were analysed by Gujarat Election Watch for Lok Sabha 2009 elections. Out of these 359 candidates, 69 candidates or 19.22% declared pending criminal cases against them. Out of these 69 candidates, 34 candidates had serious criminal cases pending like murder, attempt to murder, kidnapping, robbery, extortion etc.

Party wise break up for candidates with pending criminal cases


Total 69 candidates contesting elections from Gujarat had pending criminal cases against them. Out of the total 26 candidates of BJP, 11 had pending criminal cases. 10 out of 26 candidates of INC and 24 out of 174 independent candidates had pending criminal cases against them.

Out of these 69 candidates with pending criminal cases, 34 had serious criminal cases pending against them. These serious cases include murder and related charges, kidnapping, extortion, dacoity, theft, robbery etc. The break up is given in the table below.

Figure: Serious IPC section break up for candidates of major parties





Figure: Comparison total serious crimes vs. total violent crimes (murder, kidnapping etc)- Party wise

Pending criminal cases- analysis for MPs


Out of the 26 MPs from Gujarat in Lok Sabha 2009, 11 MPs have pending criminal cases against them. Out of these 11 MPs, there are pending serious criminal cases against 7 MPs. Contrasting this with Lok Sabha 2004, there were only 6 MPs with pending criminal cases and 4 with pending serious criminal cases.

Given below is a comparative analysis for MPs with pending criminal cases elected from Gujarat. The presence of MPs with pending criminal cases from Gujarat in Lok Sabha 2009 has increased by 83%. The number of total pending criminal cases has increased by an alarming 338%.

Figure: Comparison Lok Sabha 2004 & Lok Sabha 2009- MPs with pending criminal cases





Figure: Percent MPs with pending criminal cases- Party wise










Analysis based on assets- for MPs

Out of the 26 MPs in Lok Sabha 2009, 12 are crorepatis as compared to 6 crorepati MPs from Lok Sabha 2004, i.e. an increase of 100%. The average asset of a MP in Lok Sabha 2004 was Rs 72 lakhs which rose to Rs 208 lakhs in 2009. Between 2004 & 2009 there has been an average asset increase of 188 % for MPs.

Figure: Comparison average assets for candidates & MPs in Lok Sabha 2009




Asset position in constituency among candidates and chances of winning


