Haryana Election Watch*

Lok Sabha elections 2009

Lok Sabha 2009 elections for 10 constituencies of Haryana were held on May 7, 2009. This chapter includes the analysis of voting trend, criminalization, money power, gender etc. in these elections. The analysis is based on the self declared affidavits filed by candidates along with nomination papers.

Growth of political parties

In Lok Sabha 2004, 24 parties contested elections which rose to 37 in Lok Sabha 2009 elections; this reflects a rise of 54% in the number of parties from 2004 to 2009.

Growth in number of candidates

160 candidates contested in Lok Sabha 2004 elections and this number increased to 210 candidates in Lok Sabha 2009 elections. This shows a rise of 31% in the contesting candidates from 2004 to 2009.

Executive summary for candidates and MPs

Summary for candidates

- Out of 210 candidates affidavits of 204 candidates contested in Lok Sabha 2009 elections were analyzed by Haryana Election Watch (HEW).
- Out of these 204 candidates, 21 candidates or 10% declared pending criminal cases against them. INC had 2 out of 10 contested candidates with pending criminal cases whereas INLD had 3 out of 5 contested candidates with pending criminal cases.
- Out of 21 candidates with pending criminal cases, 8 had pending serious criminal cases against them.
- There were 20 IPC charges of heinous nature on the candidates.
- There were 4 red alert constituencies in Haryana where 3 or more contesting candidates had pending criminal cases. Both Bhiwani-Mahendragarh & Faridabad constituency had 4 contesting candidates with pending criminal cases whereas Hisar & Rohtak had 3 candidates each with pending criminal cases.
- A total of 61 candidates out of 204 i.e. 30% candidates were crorepatis.
- A total of 6 candidates from Haryana had declared their assets less than Rs.10,000 with 2 candidates declaring zero assets & 4 declaring assets of Rs. 5,000/- each.
- A total of 27 candidates from Haryana declared liabilities above 5 lakhs in which 3 candidates had liabilities of more than one crore.

- The average asset per candidate for INC was Rs. 17.49 crores (this includes one candidate with assets of 131 crores. If we exclude assets of this candidate then average asset per candidate for INC comes out to be 4.87 crores), INLD was Rs 8.05 crores and for HJCBL it was Rs 6.13 crores.
- A total of 61% of candidates (124 of 204) had not furnished PAN card details.
- Numbers of women candidates were just 14 (7%) as compared to 190 of men (93%).
- 41% candidates (84 of 204) were graduates & above.
- INC which won 90% of the seats managed to get only 42% votes, HJCBL with 10% seats got 10% votes.

Summary for MPs

- Out of 10 MPs in Lok Sabha 2009 from Haryana, 2 MPs have pending criminal cases against them. Whereas in Lok Sabha 2004, 1 MP had pending criminal cases against him.
- One MP from Haryana in the present Lok Sabha has serious pending criminal case against him. In 2004 Lok Sabha also 1 MP had serious pending criminal case against him.
- The number of crorepati MPs has increased from 3 in Lok Sabha 2004 to 9 in Lok Sabha 2009.
- The average asset per MP for INC is Rs. 19.36 crores (this includes 1 MP with assets of 131 crores) and for HJCBL it is Rs 6.51 crores.
- Average asset for a MP from Haryana is Rs 18.07 crores (this includes 1 MP with assets of 131 crores).
- Out of 14 women candidates, only 2 managed to win. Hence only 20% of MPs from Haryana in current Lok Sabha are women.

Voting and winning trend

The % of votes polled by major parties


In Haryana INC won 9 out of 10 seats i.e.90% of the seats in Lok Sabha 2009 elections but received only 42% of the votes cast. The total electorates in Haryana were 1,20,87,679 and the total votes cast were 81, 56,553. Party wise details are given below.

Figure Per cent of votes cast in Haryana - party wise




Candidates Vs MPs

Analysis based on pending criminal cases

Pending criminal cases- analysis for candidates

Total 204 affidavits were analysed by HEW for Lok Sabha 2009 elections. Out of these 204 candidates, 21 candidates or 10% declared pending criminal cases against them. Out of these 21 candidates with pending criminal cases, 8 had pending serious criminal cases against them.


Party wise break up for candidates with pending criminal cases

Total 21 candidates contesting elections from Haryana had pending criminal cases against them. 60% candidates of INLD i.e. 3 out of 5 had pending criminal cases. INC had 2 out of 10 candidates with pending criminal cases. Party wise break up is given in the table below.

Party wise comparison of pending criminal cases on candidates in Lok Sabha 2004 & Lok Sabha 2009

A comparison between 2009 & 2004 Lok Sabha elections of candidates from 4 major parties and with pending criminal cases shows an interesting trend. In Lok Sabha 2004 elections 8% of the candidates from these 4 parties had pending criminal cases against them which increased to 20% of candidates with pending criminal cases from these same parties in Lok Sabha 2009 elections.

Pending criminal cases- analysis for MPs

Out of 10 MPs from Haryana in Lok Sabha 2009, 2 MPs have pending criminal cases against them. Contrasting this with Lok Sabha 2004, 1 MP had pending criminal case.

Given below is a comparative analysis for MPs with pending criminal cases elected from Haryana. Although the presence of MPs with pending criminal cases from Haryana in Lok Sabha 2009 has increased by 1 MP from Lok Sabha 2004 but overall pending criminal cases against MPs has reduced to 3 in Lok Sabha 2009 from 5 in Lok Sabha 2004. There is no change in the status of MPs from Haryana from Lok Sabha 2004 to Lok Sabha 2009 having pending serious criminal cases against them.




Analysis based on assets – for candidates

In Haryana out of 204 candidates whose affidavits were analysed in Lok Sabha 2009 elections 61 candidates were found crorepatis . 8 out of 10 candidates' i.e. 80% candidates of INC were crorepatis whereas in the case of HJCBL 8 out of 9 candidates' i.e. 89% candidates were crorepatis.




There is an increase of 200% in number of crorepati MPs in Haryana from Lok Sabha 2004 to Lok Sabha 2009. Average assets of MPs in Lok Sabha 2009 also show an increasing trend if compared to Lok Sabha 2004 with an increase of 51% in it.

Chances of winning based on assets

As can be seen from the table, the higher the assets the more are the chances of winning of a candidate. In the Lok Sabha 2009 elections, 33% of the candidates who declared assets of Rs 5 crore and above won. On the other hand none of the candidates with assets less than 10 lakh won. The election results seemed to be highly influenced by the money power of the candidates



Figure: Comparison average assets for candidates & MPs in Lok Sabha 2009




Asset position in constituency among candidates and chances of winning


Female representation in Lok Sabha 2009 elections
