# करोड़पति हैं हमारे उम्मीदवार न वाहन है, न पेन नंबर

मध्यप्रदेश विधानसभा चुनाव में किस्मत आजमाने वाले अनेक करोड़पति उम्मीदवारों के पास न तो अपने वाहन हैं और न ही वे आयकर के पर्सनल अकॉउन्ट्स नंबर (पेन) के बारे में कुछ जानते हैं। दूसरी तरफ, कुछ उम्मीदवारों की कुल संपत्ति 20 हजार रुपये से कम है और पांच उम्मीदवार ऐसे भी हैं जिनके पास संपत्ति के नाम पर एक धेला भी नहीं है।

**चुनाव डेस्क, भोपाल.** उम्मीदवारी के पर्चों के साथ दाखिल शपथपत्र के मुताबिक कांग्रेस, भाजपा, भारतीय जनशक्ति (भाजश), बहुजन समाज पार्टी (बसपा) और समाजवादी पार्टी (सपा) के 205 उम्मीदवार एक करोड़ रुपये से अधिक की संपत्ति के मालिक हैं, लेकिन इनमें से 58 को अपने पेन नंबर के बारे में कुछ नहीं मालूम। कुल 266 प्रत्याशियों ने खुद को वाहन-विहीन घोषित किया है, लेकिन इनमें से 29 ऐसे भी हैं जिनकी संपत्ति 75 लाख से अधिक है। यह जानकारी वर्ष 2003 से चुनावों पर नजर रखने वाले दिल्ली के एनजीओ एसोसिएशन ऑफ डेमोक्रेटिक रीफॉर्मर्स (एडीआर) से जुड़े 'मध्यप्रदेश इलेक्शन वॉच' (एमपीईडब्ल्यू) ने प्रत्याशियों द्वारा दाखिल शपथपत्रों के विश्लेषण के आधार पर उजागर की है। रविवार को राज्य के चुनाव में उतरी पांच प्रमुख पार्टियों के 1084 उम्मीदवारों पर रिपोर्ट जारी करते हुए एमपीईडब्ल्यू के रakesh राजन ने बताया कि चुनाव में उतरे बाकी के पांच राज्यों में भी इसी तरह की रिपोर्ट जारी की गई है।

## उम्मीदवारों की अपराधिक पृष्ठभूमि

इस बार चुनाव के मैदान में उतरी सभी 55 राजनीतिक पार्टियों ने अपराधिक पृष्ठभूमि के प्रत्याशियों से कोई परहेज नहीं किया है। कांग्रेस ने जहां 24.53 प्रतिशत अपराधिक पृष्ठभूमि के उम्मीदवारों को उतारकर अखिल दर्जा हासिल किया है, वहीं भाजपा 19.16 प्रतिशत अपराधिक पृष्ठभूमि के उम्मीदवारों के साथ ज्यादा पीछे नहीं है। उत्तरप्रदेश में अपने-अपने इलेक्शन गैंग्स के बाद सपा (13.97 प्रतिशत) और बसपा (13.81 प्रतिशत) मध्यप्रदेश में भी अपराधिकों को शह देने में पीछे नहीं है। स्वाध्या के तत्कालीन अपेक्षाकृत नई भाजपा पार्टी ने भी 16.48 प्रतिशत अपराधिक पृष्ठभूमि वाले उम्मीदवारों को उतारकर इस क्षेत्र में भी कसर नहीं छोड़ी है।

## कर्ज में दबे हैं भावी प्रतिनिधि

भाजपा के 25.58 प्रतिशत उम्मीदवार सरकार के दस लाख रुपये से ज्यादा के देनदार हैं। इसी तरह कांग्रेस के 24.88 प्रतिशत, बसपा के 11.42 प्रतिशत, भाजश के 6.55 प्रतिशत और सपा के 5.55 प्रतिशत प्रत्याशी दस लाख रुपये से अधिक के कर्जदार हैं। एक करोड़ से ज्यादा की देनदारी वाले कांग्रेस के छह, भाजपा के तीन और बसपा के एक उम्मीदवार हैं।

## शिक्षित हैं अपराधी

विडंबना है कि अपराधिक पृष्ठभूमि वाले कर्जदार उम्मीदवारों में शिक्षा का प्रतिशत संतोषप्रद है। पढ़ताल में शामिल की गई पांच पार्टियों के 33.36 प्रतिशत उम्मीदवार ग्रेजुएट हैं और 16.03 प्रतिशत पोस्ट-ग्रेजुएट। क्या यह शिक्षा के मर्यादात्मक प्रभाव की ओर एक इशारा है?



## 1200 एनजीओ का गठबंधन

देशभर के करीब 12 सौ एनजीओ के गठबंधन एसोसिएशन ऑफ डेमोक्रेटिक रीफॉर्मर्स (एडीआर) की याचिका पर सुप्रीम कोर्ट ने मार्च 2003 में प्रत्याशियों की अपराधिक, आर्थिक और सौखिनिक पृष्ठभूमि पर शपथपत्र दाखिल करने के आदेश दिए थे। तभी से एडीआर विभिन्न राज्यों के इलेक्शन वॉच के माध्यम से राज्य विधानसभाओं और संसद के चुनावों में खड़े होने वाले उम्मीदवारों पर रिपोर्ट जारी करता रहा है।

**प्रदेश के विस चुनाव में पहली बार इतने अधिक दागी**

# दागियों के दम पर दंगल

जबलपुर। समय-समय पर नैतिकता का चोला ओढ़ने का ढोंग करने वाले राजनीतिक दलों ने इस बार प्रदेश के विधानसभा चुनाव में इतने दागी लोगों को टिकट बांटे कि पिछले सारे रिकार्ड ही टूट गए।

इस चुनाव में पांच बड़ी पार्टियों के 179 ऐसे उम्मीदवार अपनी किस्मत आजमा रहे हैं, जिनके खिलाफ अलग-अलग धाराओं के तहत आपराधिक मामले दर्ज हैं। प्रदेश विधानसभा के चुनाव मैदान में इतने दागी प्रत्याशी पहले कभी नहीं रहे। वर्ष 2003 के चुनाव में 153 दागी उम्मीदवारों को टिकट दिए गए थे। कांग्रेस ने इस बार सबसे ज्यादा 59 दागी प्रत्याशियों को टिकट दिए हैं, जबकि 35 दागियों के साथ समाजवादी पार्टी दूसरे नंबर पर है। इनके अलावा बसपा ने 30, भाजपा ने 28 और

भाजपा ने 27 दागियों को चुनाव मैदान में उतारा है। हालांकि उम्मीदवारों की कुल संख्या की बात की जाए तो पिछले विधानसभा चुनाव की तुलना में इस बार करीब एक हजार प्रत्याशी ज्यादा हैं। मध्यप्रदेश इलेक्शन वाच की रिपोर्ट तैयार कर रहे कॉमन वेल्थ ह्यूमन राइट्स इंनिशिएटिव के एक्सटर्नल कोलैबोरेटर डा. राकेश रंजन ने बताया कि इस चुनाव में 3168 प्रत्याशी अपनी किस्मत आजमा रहे हैं, जिसमें विभिन्न राजनैतिक दलों के 1326 प्रत्याशी शामिल हैं। बाकी सभी निर्दलीय उम्मीदवार हैं। जबकि वर्ष 2003 के विधानसभा चुनाव में कुल 2171 प्रत्याशी चुनाव मैदान में थे। उन्होंने बताया कि इंदौर-एक विधानसभा क्षेत्र से चुनाव लड़ रहे सपा के रमेश यादव पर सबसे ज्यादा 46 आपराधिक प्रकरण दर्ज हैं। जबकि पिछली बार सपा ने मुलताई विधानसभा क्षेत्र से डा. सुनीलम् को टिकट दिया था - पृष्ठ 05 पर

बकाएदारी में भी भाजपा आगे - चुनाव मैदान में उतरे भाजपा के 55 उम्मीदवारों ऐसे हैं, जिन पर दस लाख से अधिक की राशि बकाया है। इनके अलावा कांग्रेस के 53, बसपा के 24, भाजपा के 12 और सपा के 10 प्रत्याशियों पर दस लाख से अधिक का बकाया है। इसका विवरण उन्होंने अपने शपथ पत्रों में दिया है।

**सबसे ज्यादा करोड़पति कांग्रेस में** - विधानसभा चुनाव लड़ने वालों में कांग्रेस के सर्वाधिक 82 प्रत्याशी ऐसे हैं, जिनके पास एक करोड़ रुपए से अधिक की संपत्ति है। भाजपा ने 65, भाजपा ने 30, बसपा ने 21 और सपा ने 7 करोड़पति उम्मीदवारों को टिकट दिए हैं।

**रिटर्न दाखिल करने में भाजपाई आगे** - चुनाव लड़ने वाले भाजपा प्रत्याशी इनकम टैक्स रिटर्न भरने में आगे हैं। भाजपा के 112 प्रत्याशियों ने शपथ पत्र में अपना पैन कार्ड नंबर अंकित किया है, जबकि कांग्रेस के 111 प्रत्याशियों के पास पैन कार्ड हैं। इसके अलावा बसपा के 68, भाजपा के 51 और सपा के 31 प्रत्याशियों ने शपथ पत्र में पैन कार्ड होने की जानकारी दी है।

जिन पर सबसे ज्यादा 63 मामले दर्ज थे।

हत्या के पांच आरोपी - इस चुनाव में हत्या के पांच आरोपी मैदान में हैं, जिन पर पार्टियों ने भरोसा जताते टिकट दिए हैं। इनमें बसपा के दो, कांग्रेस, सपा और भाजपा के एक-एक प्रत्याशी शामिल हैं। इसके अलावा आठ प्रत्याशियों पर हत्या के प्रयास के मामले दर्ज हैं, जिनमें कांग्रेस और सपा के तीन-तीन तथा भाजपा और भाजपा के एक-एक उम्मीदवार शामिल हैं।

## मप्र में 190 दागी मैदान में

### सामाजिक संस्था ने शोध में किया खुलासा

भोपाल। मध्यप्रदेश के विधानसभा चुनाव में प्रमुख राजनीतिक दलों ने 190 अपराधियों को चुनाव मैदान में उतारा है, इनमें जहां कांग्रेस 24.53 प्रतिशत अपराधिक उम्मीदवारों के साथ अव्वल नम्बर पर है वहीं भाजपा ने 19.16 फीसदी अपराधिक पृष्ठभूमि के प्रत्याशियों को उतारकर जता दिया है कि दौड़ में वह भी पीछे नहीं है।

यह खुलासा मप्र इलेक्शन वॉच नामक संस्था द्वारा किए गए शोध में किया गया है। संस्था के प्रदेश समन्वयक डॉ. राकेश रंजन ने बहाने पत्रकारों से चर्चा में बताया कि नेशनल कैम्पेन फॉर इलेक्शन रीफॉर्म की राज्य इकाई के तौर पर मप्र इलेक्शन वॉच ने विधानसभा चुनाव लड़ रहे प्रमुख राजनीतिक दलों के प्रत्याशियों द्वारा शपथ पत्रों में दी गई जानकारी को इसका आधार बनाया है। डॉ. रंजन ने बताया कि प्रदेश में चुनाव लड़ रहे कुल 3 हजार 179 उम्मीदवारों में से एक हजार उम्मीदवारों पर यह शोध किया गया है और उनके इस अभियान में 84 संस्थाओं ने मिलकर जानकारी जुटाई है। शोध के मुताबिक प्रदेश में सर्वाधिक 46 मुकदमे इंदौर-1 के सपा प्रत्याशी रोशन यादव कदवरम के खिलाफ दर्ज हैं।

वहीं मुलताई के सपा प्रत्याशी डॉ. सुनीलम 25 प्रकरण के साथ दूसरे और जबलपुर पश्चिम के भाजपा प्रत्याशी हेमन्तजीत सिंह बन्बू 16 प्रकरण के साथ तीसरे नम्बर पर है। इसके साथ ही प्रदेश के राजनगर, अमरपाटन, जबलपुर पश्चिम, चौरई, भोपाल उत्तर,

भोपाल मध्य, नरसिंहगढ़, खण्डवा, इंदौर-3, महु, सुवासरा ऐसे विधानसभा क्षेत्र हैं जहां तीन या इसके अधिक राजनीतिक दलों ने अपराधिक पृष्ठभूमि के प्रत्याशियों को मैदान में उतारा है।

### ■ कम नहीं मनी पावर

संस्था के शोध के अनुसार कांग्रेस द्वारा टिकट पाए 38.49 प्रतिशत उम्मीदवार जहां एक करोड़ की सम्पत्ति के मालिक हैं वहीं भाजपा में 30.23 प्रतिशत उम्मीदवारों के पास एक करोड़ से अधिक की सम्पत्ति है। भाजपा में 16.39 प्रतिशत करोड़पति हैं तो बसपा में 10 प्रतिशत और सपा में 3.8 प्रतिशत करोड़पति उम्मीदवारों को टिकट दिया है। वहीं प्रदेश में पांच उम्मीदवार ऐसे हैं जो नकदी के मामले में ठनठन गोपाल हैं।

### ■ महिलाएं मात्र सात फीसदी

शोध में पाया गया कि सभी प्रमुख राजनीतिक दलों ने कुल मिलाकर मात्र सात फीसदी महिलाओं को ही विधानसभा चुनाव में प्रत्याशी बनाया है। इनमें कांग्रेस ने 29, भाजपा ने 23, सपा ने 16, भाजपा ने 14 और बसपा ने 13 महिलाओं को टिकट दिए हैं।

### ■ कर्ज के बोझ तले प्रत्याशी

मध्यप्रदेश के चुनावी मैदान में 16 प्रतिशत उम्मीदवार ऐसे हैं जो कर्ज के बोझ तले दबे हैं। भाजपा के 25.58 प्रतिशत उम्मीदवारों पर 10 लाख से अधिक की देनदारियां हैं। जबकि कांग्रेस के 24.88, बसपा के 11.42, भाजपा के 6.5 और सपा के 5.55 प्रतिशत उम्मीदवार कर्जदार हैं। -न्यू

### लखपति पर वाहनविहीन

प्रदेश में चुनाव लड़ रहे 29 उम्मीदवार ऐसे हैं, जिनके पास 75 लाख से अधिक की सम्पत्ति है लेकिन वह वाहनविहीन हैं। भोजपुर से भाजपा प्रत्याशी सुरेन्द्र पटवा ने अपनी कुल सम्पत्ति 6 करोड़ 52 लाख 47 हजार दर्शाई है, लेकिन इनके पास वाहन नहीं है। इसी तरह अमरपाटन के कांग्रेस प्रत्याशी डॉ. राजेन्द्र कुमार सिंह की 5 करोड़ 52 लाख रुपये की सम्पत्ति है पर वाहन नहीं है। इसके अलावा बालमुकुंद गौतम (धार) मनोज पटेल (देवालपुर), स्वतंत्र सिंह (मुरा), सज्जन सिंह वर्मा (सोनकच्छ), शैलेन्द्र कुमार जैन (सागर), पारस जैन (उज्जैन उत्तर), महेश दत्त मिश्रा (जौरा), फूलचंद वर्मा (सोनकच्छ), डॉ. रामलखन सिंह (भिण्ड), जीतू पटवारी (राऊ), अरुणोदय चौबे (बुरई), नरेश राव जाधव (भोपाल उत्तर), सहित कुल 29 प्रत्याशी शामिल हैं।

## 40 फीसदी करोड़पति प्रत्याशी बने विधायक

नई दिल्ली 13 दिसम्बर (विप्र)। करोड़पति बनेगा एमएलए आप जितने ज्यादा धनी होंगे आपके सीट जीतने के चांस उतने ही ज्यादा होंगे। पांच राज्यों में सम्पन्न हाल के विधानसभा चुनावों में यही मंत्र अपना असर दिखाता जान पड़ा है। उम्मीदवारों द्वारा जमा कराये गये हलफनामों का अध्ययन करने पर पाया गया कि राजस्थान, मध्यप्रदेश, छत्तीसगढ़, मिजोरम व दिल्ली की 629 सीटों पर चुनकर आये विधायकों में से 40 फीसदी विधायक करोड़पति हैं। 3 फीसदी से कम प्रत्याशी ऐसे हैं जो पांच लाख से भी कम

संपत्ति होने के बावजूद चुनाव जीतने में कामयाब रहे हैं। दिल्ली विधानसभा के एक विधायक की औसत सम्पत्ति 2.86 करोड़ है, जबकि एक भाजपा विधायक की औसत सम्पत्ति 2.8 करोड़ रुपये और कांग्रेस विधायक की औसत सम्पत्ति 2.7 करोड़ है। दिल्ली में 31 फीसदी करोड़पति जिसकी संपत्ति 5 करोड़ रुपये से अधिक है चुनाव जीतने में सफल हुए हैं। जबकि 5 लाख रुपये से कम संपत्ति वाले कोई भी प्रत्याशी चुनाव नहीं जीता है। इसके विपरीत छत्तीसगढ़ में हर दूसरा करोड़ पति जिसकी संपत्ति 3 करोड़ से अधिक

है और जो चुनाव लड़ा है जीतने में सफल रहा है। इसकी तुलना में 5 लाख से कम संपत्ति रखने वाले उम्मीदवारों में से केवल 2 फीसदी ही चुनाव जीतने में सफल हुए हैं। दिल्ली में सभी विधायक या तो लखपति या करोड़पति हैं। कुल 46 विधायक करोड़पति हैं जिसमें कांग्रेस के 24 भाजपा के 19 व बसपा के दो विधायक हैं। मध्यप्रदेश में 12 करोड़पति विधायकों के पास पैन कार्ड नहीं है। दिल्ली के 12 करोड़पति विधायकों के पास अपना खुद का वाहन नहीं है।

किसी ने नहीं दिया महिलाओं पर ध्यान

# 75 पार, चुनाव में दम से सरोकार

भोपाल (रवींद्र जैन)। कहते हैं कि राजनीति में रिटायरमेंट की कोई उम्र नहीं होती। यही कारण है कि इस चुनाव में 13 ऐसे प्रत्याशी मैदान में हैं जो 75 साल की उम्र पार कर चुके हैं। खास बात यह है कि इनमें एक महिला भी शामिल है। देश में महिलाओं को बेशक राजनीतिक आरक्षण देने की बकालत सभी दल कर रहे हैं। लेकिन इस चुनाव में किसी भी दल ने महिलाओं को 15 प्रतिशत से ज्यादा टिकट नहीं दिए। जबकि महिलाओं की आबादी 50 प्रतिशत है। मध्यप्रदेश के 230 विधानसभा सीटों पर कुल 3179 प्रत्याशी अपना भाग्य आजमा रहे हैं। इनमें 2953 पुरुष और 226 महिलाएं हैं। चुनाव मैदान में उतरे लोगों पर नजर दौड़ाई जाए तो इनमें कई उम्र

दराज हैं। चुनाव आयोग के आंकड़ों के अनुसार मग्न में 25 से 34 वर्ष की उम्र के 848 प्रत्याशी मैदान में हैं। इनमें 779 पुरुष और 59 महिलाएं शामिल हैं। इसी प्रकार 35 से 44 वर्ष की उम्र के कुल 1151 उम्मीदवार भाग्य आजमा रहे हैं इनमें 1041 पुरुष 110 महिलाएं हैं। 45 से 54 की उम्र के कुल 749 प्रत्याशियों में 701 पुरुष हैं। 55 से 74 की उम्र के 418 प्रत्याशियों में 8 महिलाएं और 410 पुरुष हैं। 75 की उम्र से ऊपर के भी 13 प्रत्याशी मैदान में डटे हैं।

इस चुनाव में किसी भी राजनीतिक दल ने महिलाओं पर मेहरबानी नहीं की। संसद में महिला आरक्षण बिल के पक्ष में चिल्लाने वाली दोनों कम्युनिस्ट पार्टियों ने मग्न में एक भी महिला को प्रत्याशी नहीं बनाया है। प्रदेश में महिलाओं को सबसे ज्यादा 29 टिकट कांग्रेस पार्टी ने दिए हैं। दूसरा नंबर भाजपा का है जिसने 23 महिलाएं मैदान में उतारी हैं। सपा की ओर से कुल 16 महिलाएं मैदान में हैं। मायावती के नेतृत्व वाली बहुजन समाज पार्टी ने प्रदेश के 228 प्रत्याशियों में मात्र 13 महिलाओं को टिकट दिया है।

## 230 सीटों पर कोई नहीं

प्रदेश में ऐसी कोई पार्टी नहीं है, जो सभी सीटों पर चुनाव लड़ रही हो। कांग्रेस, भाजपा और बसपा तीनों ही 228 सीटों पर चुनाव लड़ रहे हैं। राष्ट्रीय जनता दल चार, सीपीआई 21, सीपीएम 12 और एनसीपी 3 सीटों पर भाग्य आजमा रही हैं।

# बाहुबलियों की भरमार

बिहार और उप्र की तर्ज पर मप्र में भी आपराधिक छवि के 190 उम्मीदवार विधानसभा चुनाव में किस्मत आजमा रहे हैं। किसी पर फिरोती तो किसी पर हत्या जैसे गम्भीर आरोप भी लगे हुए हैं। ऐसे बाहुबलियों को टिकट देने में तीसरे मोर्चे के साथ ही सत्तारूढ़ दल भाजपा और विपक्षी कांग्रेस भी पीछे नहीं हैं

भोपाल, 23 नवम्बर (यूपी)

उत्तर के विधानसभा चुनाव में इस बार पहले से राज्य उत्तरप्रदेश और बिहार की तर्ज पर बड़ी संख्या में बाहुबलियों और आपराधिक छवि के उम्मीदवारों को मैदान में है। तैयारी की बात यह है कि इनके अगले उम्मीदवार बनाने में सत्तारूढ़ दल भाजपा और मुख्य विपक्षी दल कांग्रेस सहित खुद को तीसरी ताकत बनाने वाले राजनीतिक दल भी पीछे नहीं हैं।

ये बाहुबलियों खुद उम्मीदवारों के अपने शायद पत्र बचा कर रहे हैं। निर्वाचन अधिकारों के सम्मेलन किए गए शायद पत्र में 190 उम्मीदवारों ने स्वीकार किया है कि उन पर आपराधिक ज़रूरत दर्ज है। इनमें सबसे ज्यादा 52 उम्मीदवार कांग्रेस के टिकट पर चुनाव लड़ रहे हैं। दूसरे नम्बर पर सत्तारूढ़ दल भाजपा है। भाजपा ने आपराधिक छवि के 41 उम्मीदवारों को मैदान में उतारा है। पूर्व मुख्यमंत्री

उत्तर प्रदेश की पार्टी भारतीय जनता दल भी भाजपा और कांग्रेस से पीछे नहीं है। भाजपा ने 30 ऐसे व्यक्तियों को टिकट दिए हैं। वहीं भाजपा के बहाल सभाज पार्टी ने 29 और मुलायम सिंह यादव की समाजवादी पार्टी ने 25 ऐसे लोगों को टिकट दिए हैं। इनके अलावा 13 बाहुबलियों ने निर्दलीय की किस्मत आजमा रहे हैं।

## रैड अलर्ट क्षेत्र

पारसी इलेक्शन ब्रांच नामक एक स्वयं संचालित संस्था ने इन शायद पत्रों का अध्ययन करने के बाद विचार को अपनी रिपोर्ट में उल्लेख को जारी की। रिपोर्ट में कहा गया है कि 12 विधानसभा क्षेत्र ऐसे हैं, जहाँ आपराधिक छवि के एक साथ कई



उम्मीदवार चुनाव मैदान में हैं। ये विधानसभा क्षेत्र हैं, राजगढ़, अमरापटन, जबलपुर, पंचवर्मा, चोर्डा, भोपाल उत्तर, नरैला, भोपाल मध्य, नरसिंहगढ़, खंडवा, इंदौर क्रमिक 3, जो अम्बेडकर नगर महु, और सुवासरा। आपराधिक छवि के उम्मीदवारों को ज्यादा संख्या होने के कारण संस्था ने इन विधानसभा क्षेत्रों को रैड अलर्ट सूची में रखा है।

## मनी पॉवर भी-

इस चुनाव में मनी पॉवर को जोर भी दिखाई दे रहा है। रिपोर्ट के अनुसार कांग्रेस में टिकट पाए 38.49 प्रतिशत उम्मीदवार जहाँ एक करोड़ से अधिक की संपत्ति के मालिक हैं, वहीं भाजपा के 30.23 प्रतिशत उम्मीदवारों के पास भी एक करोड़ से अधिक की संपत्ति है। भाजपा 16.39 प्रतिशत करोड़पति उम्मीदवारों को टिकट देकर तीसरे स्थान पर है। वहीं बसपा एवं सपा ने क्रमशः 10 और 3.8 प्रतिशत ऐसे उम्मीदवारों को टिकट दिए हैं, जिनकी कुल संपत्ति एक करोड़ से अधिक है। आयकर विभाग यह है कि कथक्था से बचाने के डॉ राजेन्द्र सूर्यवंशी ऐसे करोड़पति उम्मीदवार हैं, जिनके पास पैन नम्बर तक नहीं है।

किसी पर और एक आपराधिक मामला भी दर्ज है तो वह बचतारी को नोटों के बांध नहीं समझा जाता, लेकिन यह दुर्भाग्य है कि ऐसे लोग चुनाव लड़ सकते हैं। ऐसा कोई कानून बनना चाहिए ताकि आपराधिक छवि के लोगों को चुनाव लड़ने से रोका जा सके। हम लोग इस संबंध में जल्दी ही सुप्रीम कोर्ट में एक जनहित याचिका दायर करने वाले हैं।

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## Madhya Pradesh 2008 Assembly Elections

Madhya Pradesh Assembly Elections 2008 were held during the month of November, 2008. A total of 3179 candidates contested in the Madhya Pradesh Assembly Elections, out of which Madhya Pradesh Election Watch (MPEW) & Association for Democratic Reforms (ADR) have analyzed the self-disclosed data of 2965 candidates. This report includes the analysis of criminal, financial, and other details of 2965 candidates and 220 MLAs (out of 230 MLAs).

This report is based on the analysis of information provided by the contesting candidates in their self-declared affidavits that they submit to the Election Commission of India (ECI). This affidavit constitutes the mandatory component of a candidate's nomination-papers so as to present his/her candidature for an election.

### Representation of political parties

In 2003 Madhya Pradesh Assembly Elections, 40 political parties contested which rose to 54 in 2008 Madhya Pradesh Assembly Elections. This reflects a rise of 35% in the number of political parties contested from Madhya Pradesh 2003 Assembly Elections to Madhya Pradesh 2008 Assembly Elections.

### Executive summary of Candidates and MLAs

#### Summary of Candidates

Madhya Pradesh Election Watch (MPEW) has analyzed affidavits of 2965 out of 3179 candidates who contested in the Madhya Pradesh 2008 Assembly Elections.

#### Criminal

- **Candidates with Criminal Cases:** Out of these 2965 candidates analyzed for Madhya Pradesh Assembly Elections, 447 candidates or 15 % declared criminal cases against them.
- **Party wise Candidates with Criminal Cases:** Amongst major parties, every party has given tickets to candidates who have declared criminal cases. INC has 68 out of 217 (31 %), BJP has 48 out of 216 (22 %) , BSP had 41 out of 207 (20 %), BJS had 46 out of 186 (25 %), SP had 29 out of 170 (17 %), and LJP had 14 out of 111 (13 %) candidates with declared criminal cases.
- **Candidates with Serious Criminal Cases:** Out of these 447 candidates with declared criminal cases, 257 (9%) have declared serious criminal cases like murder, attempt to murder, kidnapping, robbery, extortion, rape etc. INC has 33, BJP has 22, BSP has 26, BJS has 25, SP has 21, and GGP has 10 such candidates.
- **Candidates with Heinous & Violent Crime Cases:** The top three candidates who have declared serious criminal cases of murder, Attempt to murder, kidnapping and theft against them are: (1) Chhatarsingh Darbar (of BJP from Gandhwani constituency) has declared 1 charge related to murder and 3 charges related to attempt to murder. (2) Roshan Yadav Kadwam of SP from Indore-1 constituency has declared 3 charges related to attempt to murder (3) Vishwas Tripathi (of IND contesting from Ujjain Uttar constituency) has declared 2 charges related to murder and 1 charge related to attempt to murder.
- **Candidate with rape charge:** 1 candidate has declared charges related to rape against himself, namely Rampal Singh Kushwah of SP from Ater constituency.

- **Red Alert Constituencies:** There are a total of 44 Red Alert Constituencies (i.e. where 3 or more contesting candidates have declared criminal cases)

### **Financial**

- **Average Assets:** Average Asset per candidate (of 2965 candidates) in 2008 Madhya Pradesh Assembly Elections is **Rs. 34.90 lakhs**. Among major parties, the average asset per candidate for INC is **Rs 1.61 Crores** (217 candidates), for **BJP is 1.06 Crores** (216 candidates), for **BSP is 57.29 lakhs** (207 candidates), for **BJSH is 46.70 lakhs** (186 candidates), and for **SP is Rs 21 lakhs** (170 candidates).
- **Corepati Candidates:** A total of **243 candidates** out of 2965 analyzed i.e. 8% are corepati.
- **Highest Asset Candidates:** The top three candidates who have declared the highest assets are Sanjay Pathak of INC from Vijayraghgarh constituency who has declared the highest assets worth Rs. 34.19 crores, followed by Satyanarayan Patel, of INC from Depalpur constituency with Rs. 30.01 crores worth of assets and Raghuraj Singh Chaurdiya an INC candidate from Neemuch constituency with assets worth Rs. 22.70 crores.
- **Low Assets:** A total of 56 candidates (out of 2965 analyzed) have declared that they have zero assets. Also, 79 candidates (out of 2965 analyzed) have declared assets less than Rs. 10 thousand (and more than Rs. 0)
- **INC and BJP candidates with lowest assets:** Dr. Prabhulal Jatwa of BJP from Ghatiya constituency who has declared the lowest assets worth Rs 11.63 thousand while Dr. Kalpana Parulekar, INC candidate from Mahidpur constituency has lowest declared assets worth Rs 96.52 thousand.
- **High Liabilities:** A total of 9 candidates out of 2965 analyzed have declared liabilities of Rs. 1 crore or above.
- **High Liability Candidates:** The top three candidates with highest liabilities are Surendra Patwa, a BJP candidate from Bhojpur who has declared the highest liabilities worth Rs. 3.17 Crores followed by Sanjay Sharma of BJP from Tendukheda constituency with liabilities of Rs. 2.70 Crores and Sanjay Shukla of INC from Indore-1 constituency with liabilities worth Rs 2.22 crores.
- **Candidates with no PAN:** 2376 (81%) out of 2965 candidates analyzed in the Madhya Pradesh 2008 Assembly Elections, have not declared their PAN details. 70 Corepati Candidates have not declared their PAN details.
- **Undeclared PAN Party Wise:** 101 out of 216 candidates of BJP have not declared their PAN, 95 out of 217 of INC have not declared their PAN, 133 out of 207 of BSP have not declared their PAN, 135 out of 186 of BJSH, and 142 out of 170 of SP have not declared PAN details.

### **Other Background Details (Education, Age, Gender)**

- **Candidate' Education:** A total of 945 (32%) candidates (out of 2965 analyzed) are graduate or have higher educational qualification in the Madhya Pradesh 2008 Assembly Election.
- **Candidates' Age:** A total of 17 candidates out of the total analyzed are more than 70 years of age. A total of 406 candidates are aged 30 or less.
- **15 Candidate declared his age to be less than 25 years**



- **Candidates' Gender:** Total number of women candidates who contested in the Madhya Pradesh Assembly Elections 2008 was 226 compared to 2953 men candidates, i.e. only 7% of the candidates were women.

### Summary of MLAs

Madhya Pradesh Election Watch (MPEW) has analyzed affidavits of the 220 MLAs (out of the maximum 230) of Madhya Pradesh 2008 Assembly Elections.

### Criminal

- **MLAs with Criminal Cases:** Out of these 220 MLAs analyzed for Madhya Pradesh Assembly Elections, 58 MLAs or 26% have declared criminal cases against them.
- **Party wise MLAs with Criminal Cases:** Out of 138 MLAs of **BJP- 28 (20%)** have declared criminal cases, out of 67 MLAs of **INC- 24 (36%)** have declared criminal cases, out of 7 MLAs of **BSP- 3 (43%)** have declared criminal cases, out of 4 MLAs of **BJSH- 2 (50%)** has declared criminal case and the only MLA of **SP- 1 (100%)** has declared criminal cases against him.
- **MLAs with serious criminal cases:** Out of the 58 MLAs who have declared criminal cases against themselves, 27 (12%) MLAs declared serious criminal cases against themselves.
- **MLAs with Heinous and Violent crimes cases:** The top three MLAs from major parties who have declared serious criminal cases of murder, attempt to murder, kidnapping and theft against them are: (1) Paras Ram Mudgal of BSP from Morena constituency who has declared 1 charge related to murder. (2) Harvansh Singh of INC from Keolari constituency has declared 1 charge related to attempt to murder. (3) Abhay Kumar Mishra of BJP from Semariya constituency has declared 1 charge related to Kidnapping.

### Financial

- **Average Assets:** Average Asset per MLA (of 220 analyzed MLAs) in 2008 Madhya Pradesh Assembly Elections is **Rs. 1.51 crores**. Among major parties, the average asset per MLA for **INC is 2.55 Crore** (67 MLAs), for **BJP is 1.12 Crore** (138 MLAs), for **BSP is 22.34 lakhs** (7 MLAs), for **BJSH is 56.79 lakhs** (4 MLAs) and for **SP is 2.37 Crore** (1 MLA).
- **Corepati MLAs:** A total of 87 out of 220 MLAs analyzed i.e. 40% are corepatis.
- **Highest Asset MLAs:** Sanjay Pathak of INC from Vijayraghgarh constituency has declared the highest assets worth **Rs 34.19 Crore**, followed by Satyanarayan Patel of INC from Depalpur who has declared assets worth **Rs 30.01 Crore** and K.P.Singh Kakkajoo of INC from Pichhore constituency with assets worth **Rs 11.48 Crore**.
- **Low Assets:** 16 MLAs have declared assets of less than Rs 10 lakh.
- **MLAs with low assets:** Dr.Kalpana Parulekar of INC from Mahidpur constituency has declared the lowest assets of **Rs. 96.52 thousands**. Ram Garib Kol of BSP from Teonthar constituency has declared assets of **Rs. 1.20 lakhs**. Radhelal Baghel of BSP from Sewda constituency has declared assets of **Rs. 2.80 lakhs**.

- **Liabilities:** A total of 18 (8%) MLAs out of 220 analyzed have declared liabilities of Rs. 25 lakhs or above.
- **High Liability MLAs:** The top three MLAs with highest liabilities are Surendra Patwa, a BJP candidate from Bhojpur with declared the highest liabilities worth **Rs. 3.17 Crores** followed by Dr.Nishith Patel of INC from Bahoriband constituency with liabilities of **Rs. 1.24 Crores** and Hari Singh Raghuvanshi “Badda” a BJP MLA from Basoda constituency with liabilities worth **Rs 75.36 lakhs**.
- **MLAs with no PAN:** 99 (45%) out of 220 MLAs have not declared their PAN details

#### **Other Background Details (Education, Gender, Age)**

- **MLAs Education:** 60% MLAs (131 of 220 analyzed) are graduates or have a higher qualification in the Madhya Pradesh Legislative Assembly of 2008.
- **MLAs Gender:** Out of 230 MLAs only 25 (11%) MLAs are women.
- **MLAs Age:** A total of 6 MLAs out of the 220 analyzed, are more than 70 years of age. A total of 4 MLAs are aged 30 or less.

## Analysis based on declared criminal cases- Candidates

Affidavits of 2965 candidates have been analyzed by Madhya Pradesh Election Watch (MPEW) for 2008 Assembly elections. Out of the 2965 candidates, 447 or 15% have declared declared criminal cases against them. Out of these 447 candidates with declared criminal cases, 257 have declared serious criminal cases like murder, attempt to murder, kidnapping, extortion, etc. declared against them.

### Party-wise break up of candidates with declared criminal cases

A total of 447 candidates contesting elections from Madhya Pradesh have declared criminal cases against them. All major parties had given tickets to candidates with declared criminal cases. INC has 68 out of 217 (31 %), BJP has 48 out of 216 (22 %) , BSP had 41 out of 207 (20 %), BJSH has 46 out of 186 (25 %), SP had 29 out of 170 (17 %), and LJP had 14 out of 111 (13 %) candidates with declared criminal cases. The party wise break up is given below:

## Analysis based on declared criminal cases – MLAs

Madhya Pradesh Election Watch (MPEW) has analyzed affidavits of 220 elected MLAs. Out of the 220 MLAs analyzed for Madhya Pradesh Assembly election, 58 MLAs or 26% have declared criminal cases against them.

### Party- wise break up of MLAs with declared criminal cases

Out of 67 MLAs of **INC- 24 (36%)** have declared criminal cases, out of 138 MLAs of **BJP - 28 (20%)** have declared criminal cases, out of 7 MLAs of **BSP- 3 (43%)** have declared criminal cases, out of 4 MLAs of **BJSH- 2 (50%)** has declared criminal case and the only MLA of **SP- 1 (100%)** has declared criminal cases against him. 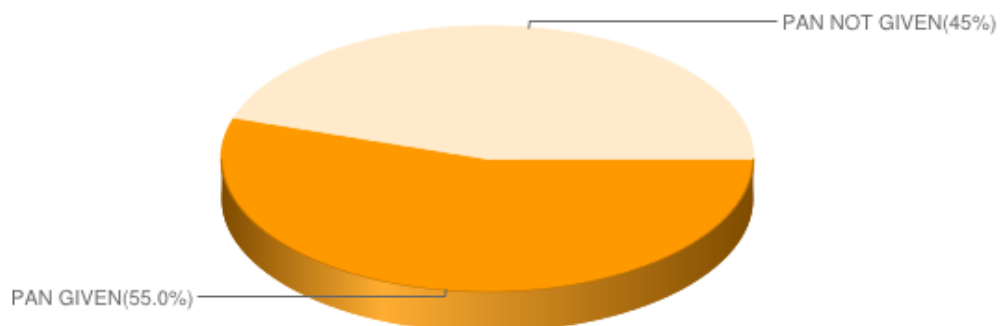

# Background on Association for Democratic Reforms (ADR) And National Election Watch (NEW)

## About ADR & NEW

Association for Democratic Reforms (ADR) was established in 1999 by group of professors from Indian Institute of Management (IIM) Ahmedabad. In 1999, a Public Interest Litigation (PIL) was filed by them with Delhi High Court asking the disclosure of criminal, financial and educational background of the candidates contesting elections. Based on this, the Supreme Court in 2002 and subsequently in 2003, made it mandatory for all candidates contesting elections to disclose Criminal, Financial and educational background prior to the polls by filing an affidavit with Election Commission.

The first election watch was conducted by ADR in 2002 for Gujrat Assembly Elections whereby detailed analysis of the backgrounds of candidates contesting elections was provided to the electorate in order to help the electorate make an informed choice during polls. Since then ADR has conducted Election Watches for almost all state and parliament elections in collaboration with the National Election Watch. It conducts multiple projects aimed at increasing transparency and accountability in the political and electoral system of the country.

## Our Achievements

- Supreme Court delivers a Judgment on a Petition filed by Lily Thomas and Lok Prahari NGO, (ADR Intervened) setting aside clause 8(4) of the Representation of the People Act, and therefore barring sitting MPs and MLAs from holding office on being Convicted in a Court of Law.
- After over a 2 year long struggle based on an RTI that was filed by ADR, the CIC delivered a landmark judgment that brought 6 National Parties under the ambit of the RTI Act.
- Times of India Social Impact Award in Advocacy and Empowerment category.
- ADR won the NASSCOM award for ICT led Innovation by Multi-stakeholder Partnerships. This award was for the Election Watch software of ADR and Webrosoft.
- ADR won two milestone judgments on disclosure of candidate's criminal and financial records from the Supreme Court in May 2002 and March 2003 respectively. Since then, 1200 NGOs from all over the country are supporting ADR and ADR in partnership with its partners has organized Citizen Election Watch for all major elections and disclosed candidate's background information to the media and the public.
- The Election Commission has completed a massive exercise based on the Gujarat Election Watch report to verify information filed by candidates in the nomination papers and affidavits, and has started proceedings against candidates with false declarations.
- A Bill on Electoral Expenses was passed in September 2003. The EC has asked candidates to file a statement of expenses in every three days during the campaign. This information is made available to citizens on request to Returning Officers, District Election Officers and the CEOs.
- Civil Society non-partisan Election Watches are springing up in different states. In the Lok Sabha 2004 Elections, 19 States and 5 Union Territories carried out Election Watches. In the Lok Sabha 2009 elections, Election Watches were held in all states and union territories in the country.
- Bihar Election Watch in October-November 2005 resulted in intense pressure on the Chief Minister designate due to the extensive media coverage of candidate's background. As a result, for the first time, Bihar has a Council of Ministers without any known criminal record.

- The Election Commission inaugurated Civil Society led National Conferences on Electoral Reforms in Ahmedabad, Bangalore, Patna, Lucknow, Mumbai, Bhopal and Chennai. These Conferences were action oriented and resulted in successful Election Watch campaigns.
- The EC issued several very significant orders in the last two years relating to candidate disclosure, ensuring those affidavits are complete, taking action against false affidavits based on complaints, and disclosing electoral expenses.
- In April 2008, ADR obtained a landmark ruling from the Central Information Commission (CIC) saying that Income Tax Returns of Political Parties would now be available in the public domain along with the assessment orders.
- In the Karnataka Assembly Elections, 2008, there was a reduction in the number of candidates with serious offenses put up by parties. There were 93 such cases against candidates in the 2008 elections, down from 217 in the 2004 assembly elections.
- Overall, the percentage of candidates with declared criminal cases came down from 20% to 14% in the assembly elections held in the country in 2008 for the states of Rajasthan, Chhattisgarh, Madhya Pradesh, NCT of Delhi and Mizoram.
- A large number of candidates with serious declared cases that contested Lok Sabha 2009 elections like Pappu Yadav, Atiq Ahmed, Mukhtar Ansari, Akhilesh Singh, etc. lost.
- The number of total serious IPC sections against MPs decrease from 296 in Lok Sabha 2004 to 274 in Lok Sabha 2009.
- On Jan 25, 2010 both the Congress Chief Ms Sonia Gandhi and leader of opposition in Lok Sabha Ms Sushma Swaraj of BJP made public statements calling for a consensus on barring candidates with criminal backgrounds from contesting elections.
- On Feb 3, 2010 Prime Minister Manmohan Singh asked his Cabinet colleagues to disclose details of their assets and liabilities and refrain from dealing with the government on immovable property.
- Because of an RTI application that ADR has been following up with the CIC for nearly the past 2 years, the contribution reports of major political parties have been made public. Added to this is the fact that the Election Commission has taken proactive steps towards bringing in some level of accountability in the functioning of the political parties by getting the ICAI to develop reporting formats for political parties
- In May, 2010, the Chief Minister of Uttar Pradesh, Ms. Mayawati had announced the expulsion of about 500 party leaders with criminal past.
- In January 2011, the Election Commission of India entrusted the Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI) with the task of developing accounting format for political parties.
- Details of the movable and immovable assets of 30 Bihar ministers, including that of CM Nitish Kumar, were uploaded on the government website in January, 2011. It is seen as a step aimed at ending corruption promised by the Chief Minister himself.
