Analysis of Funds Collected and Expenditure Incurred by Major Political Parties of Chhattisgarh during State Assembly Elections, November 2013

Executive Summary

- Political parties are required to submit a statement of election expenditure to the Election Commission within 75 days of completion of Assembly Elections.
- The expenditure statement contains details of the total amount received as funds in the form of cash, cheques and demand drafts and the total amount spent under various heads.
- The expenditure statement **contains information on the amount spent on the following heads** at the state, district and constituency levels by the party:
 - Publicity
 - o Travel expenses
 - Other expenses
 - Travel expenses of leaders and workers
 - Miscellaneous expenses
- Political parties submit these statements providing information of funds collected and spent between announcement and completion of elections. This period could be between 3 weeks to 3 months based on the notification issued by the Election Commission.
- This report analyses the funds received and expenditure incurred by Chhattisgarh's major political parties, during the election period of 33 days (18-10-2013 to 19-11-2013).

Details provided in the Election Expenditure Statement

National Parties: Funds Collected and Expenditure Incurred

- Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) has not submitted its election expenditure statement to the Election
 Commission for Chhattisgarh Assembly elections, 2013 hence the National parties considered for the report
 are INC, BSP, NCP, CPI and CPM.
- BSP declared that no funds were collected during Chhattisgarh Assembly Elections.
- Total **funds collected** by the National Parties (INC, NCP, CPI and CPM) was **Rs 10.08 crores** and total **expenditure incurred** by the National Parties was **Rs 12.30 crores**.


Regional Parties: Funds Collected and Expenditure Incurred


• Regional Parties considered for the report: LJP, Shiv Sena, SP, NPP and JDU.





- Of the above 5 regional parties which contested in the Chhattisgarh Assembly Elections, only LIP and Shiv Sena submitted their election expenditure statements to the Election Commission.
- LIP declared that the party neither collected funds nor incurred any expenditure during Chhattisgarh Assembly Elections.
- Total funds collected by Shiv Sena for the Chhattisgarh Assembly Elections: Rs 36 lakhs.
- Shiv Sena declared that the party incurred no expenditure during Chhattisgarh Assembly Elections.






Graph: Funds collected and expenditure incurred by political parties during Chhattisgarh Assembly Elections, 2013

Funds Collected and Expenditure Incurred in Cash and Cheque

- The total **funds collected** by the National and Regional Parties amounted to **Rs 10.44 crores** of which **94%** or **Rs 9.78 crores was collected by cheque/ DD** and **6%** or **Rs 66 lakhs was collected by cash.**
- While INC declared the maximum amount of Rs 9.92 crores collected in cash and cheque, the least amount was declared by NCP with Rs 75 thousand.




Graph: Funds collected by political parties during Chhattisgarh Assembly Elections, 2013






- Out of the total expenditure of Rs 12.30 crores declared by the National Parties, expense of Rs 9.95 crores (81%) was incurred by cheques while Rs 2.35 crores (19%) was spent in cash.
- INC declared an expenditure of Rs 9.89 crores paid by cheques and Rs 2.26 crores in cash while NCP declared the least total expenditure of Rs 74 thousand, incurred in cash.

Expenditure of Political Parties

- The main heads under which the political parties declare their expenses are publicity, travel, other/ miscellaneous expenses, expenditure on candidates.
- It is to be noted that the regional political parties considered for this report (LIP and Shiv Sena) declared
 that no expenditure was incurred by the parties on publicity, travel, on candidates or any other
 expenditure.
- Only INC, CPI and CPM declared expenses under publicity (Rs 88 lakhs) while INC, NCP and CPM spent Rs 52 lakhs on travel. INC and CPM spent a total of Rs 2.11 crores on other/ miscellaneous expenses while expenses on candidates by INC, CPI and CPM amounted to Rs 9.15 crores.

Expenditure of Political Parties on Publicity

- There are three main items listed under publicity expenditure: expense on media advertisement (print & electronic, bulk sms, cable, website, TV channels) publicity material (hoardings, posters, banners etc.), expenses on public meetings (processions, rallies etc.).
- INC has spent the maximum amount of Rs 48 lakhs on public meetings, while CPM spent a total of Rs 2.2 lakhs on publicity materials and CPI declared a total expenditure of Rs 51 thousand on publicity materials
- No other political parties which contested in the Chhattisgarh Assembly Elections declared any
 expenditure on publicity for the elections.





Expenditure of Political Parties on Travel

- Expenditure on travel is given under two heads: travel expenses incurred by 'star campaigners' and travel expenses of leaders and workers.
- INC declared a total expenditure of Rs 51 lakhs on travel of star campaigners while NCP declared the second highest travel expenditure of Rs 74,000 on leaders and workers.

Expenditure towards candidates

- **INC, CPI and CPM** are the only 3 parties which declared expenses towards candidates who contested in the Chhattisgarh Assembly Elections
- INC declared spending the maximum amount of Rs 9 crores on candidates while CPM spent Rs 9.8 lakhs and CPI declared Rs 4.72 lakhs as expenses towards candidates

Recommendations of ADR

- The **details of all donors** contributing to national and regional parties exclusively for their election campaigns must be declared in the public domain irrespective of the amount donated.
- A format similar to the donations report along with the date of donations, submitted to the ECI on an
 annual basis, should be prescribed for the expenditure statement so as to bring in more transparency in
 the finances of the political parties especially during elections, where reportedly black money plays a major
 role.
- The format for donations should include all modes of payments such as cash, DD, cheque and electronic transfer.
- All political parties including the unrecognized parties must submit their statements of expenditure in the format prescribed by the ECI, including details of expenditure at the state, district and constituency levels.
- Where possible, expenditure must be limited to transactions via cheque/DD/RTGS so as to reduce black money in elections.
- Similar to the shadow observers of the ECI for monitoring expenditure of candidates, there must also be observers for monitoring the expenditure of political parties.





Detailed Report

Funds collected during election period of 33 days

- The funds declared as collected by the political parties were **collected between the date of announcement** of elections and date of completion of elections: **33** days (18-10-2013 to 19-11-2013).
- Of all the six National Parties which contested in the Chhattisgarh Assembly Elections held in 2013, BJP is
 the only National Party which has not submitted its expenditure statement to the Election Commission of
 India (ECI).
- INC, BSP, NCP, CPI and CPM together declared a total of Rs 10.08 crores as funds collected.
- A total of 5 regional parties contested in the Chhattisgarh Assembly Elections namely, LIP, Shiv Sena, SP, NPP and JDU. Of the 5 parties, only LIP and Shiv Sena submitted their election expenditure statements to the ECI.
- Of the two regional parties which submitted their expenditure statements, only Shiv Sena declared that the party collected funds but did not incur any expenditure during the Chhattisgarh Assembly Elections while LJP declared that funds were neither collected nor spent during the Elections.
- Total funds collected by Shiv Sena, as declared in its expenditure statement, are Rs 36 lakhs.

Funds collected and expenditure incurred by Chhattisgarh's parties during elections

- While analyzing the statements submitted by the parties during the election to the Chhattisgarh State
 Assembly, it was seen that maximum of funds collected and expenditure incurred by the parties was by
 cheque.
- While BSP declared that no funds were collected by the party for Chhattisgarh Assembly Elections, 2013, other National Parties declared total funds of Rs 9.52 crores (94%) by cheque and Rs 56 lakhs (6%) by cash. Similarly, declared total expenditure of Rs 9.95 crores (81%) by cheque and Rs 2.35 crores (19%) by cash.
- Shiv Sena, declared a total funds of Rs 25.4 lakhs (71%) by cheque and Rs 10.3 lakhs (29%) by cash.






Total expenditure of National and Regional Parties on various heads

- The main heads under which the political parties declare their expenses are **publicity**, **travel**, **other/ miscellaneous expenses**, **expenditure on candidates**.
- It is to be noted that the **regional political parties** considered for this report (LIP and Shiv Sena) declared that **no expenditure was incurred by the parties on publicity, travel, on candidates or any other expenditure**.
- Of the total expenditure of Rs 374.02 lakhs declared by National Parties, maximum expenditure was incurred on other/miscellaneous expenses (Rs 210.62 lakhs) during Chhattisgarh Assembly Elections followed by publicity (Rs 87.99 lakhs) and travel (Rs 51.89 lakhs).
- INC spent Rs 206 lakhs out of a total expenditure of Rs 1,241 lakhs on other/ miscellaneous expenses which constitutes 17% of the total expenditure of the party and Rs 83.5 lakhs on publicity (7%).
- While NCP incurred expenditure only on travel (Rs 74 thousand) CPM spent Rs 9.80 lakhs (54%) on candidates' expenses and Rs 4.62 lakhs (25%) on other/ miscellaneous expenses.

Expenditure on Publicity incurred by political parties of Chhattisgarh

- There are three main items listed under publicity expenditure: **expense on media advertisement** (print & electronic, bulk sms, cable, website, TV channels) **publicity material** (hoardings, posters, banners etc.), **expenses on public meetings** (processions, rallies etc.).
- INC has spent the maximum amount of Rs 48 lakhs on public meetings, followed by media advertisement (Rs 21.5 lakhs) and publicity materials (Rs 14 lakhs). INC, CPI and CPM together, spent a total of Rs 87.99 lakhs on publicity.
- No other political parties which contested in the Chhattisgarh Assembly Elections declared any
 expenditure on publicity for the elections.

Expenditure on Travel incurred by political parties of Chhattisgarh

- Expenditure on travel is given under two heads: travel expenses incurred by 'star campaigners' and travel expenses of leaders and workers.
- INC declared a total expenditure of Rs 51 lakhs on travel of star campaigners and incurred no expenditure on travel of leaders while NCP declared the second highest travel expenditure of Rs 74,000 on travel of leaders and CPM incurred a total of Rs 15,000 on travel of star campaigners, leaders and workers.

Expenditure towards candidates

- **INC, CPI and CPM** are the only 3 parties which declared expenses towards candidates who contested in the Chhattisgarh Assembly Elections.
- INC declared spending the maximum amount of Rs 9 crores on candidates while CPM spent Rs 9.8 lakhs and CPI declared Rs 4.72 lakhs as expenses towards candidates.
