ANALYSIS OF INCOME, EXPENDITURE AND DONATIONS RECEIVED BY MAJOR POLITICAL PARTIES OF CHHATTISGARH

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Analysis of income, expenditure and donations received by major political parties of Chhattisgarh [FY 2012-13]

This report focuses on various sources of income and items of expenditure of National Political Parties and the regional parties of Chhattisgarh during the Financial Year 2012-13. The National Parties include Indian National Congress (INC), Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), Nationalist Congress Party (NCP), Communist Party of India (CPI) and Communist Party of India (Marxist) (CPM). The regional parties include Shiv Sena (SHS), Samajwadi Party (SP), Janata Dal (United) (JDU), Lok Jan Shakti Party (LJP) and National People's Party (NPP).

Executive summary

II. Total income versus total expenditure of political parties:

• The total income and expenditure of political parties is calculated from their IT returns filed with the Income Tax Department annually.




Chart: Comparison of total income received and expenditure incurred by political parties of Chhattisgarh during FY 2012-13

III. Total income of political parties of Chhattisgarh:





• The total income of National Parties for FY 2012-13 was Rs. 991.21 crores. INC declared the highest total income of Rs. 425.69 crores, followed by BJP with Rs. 324.16 crores and BSP with a declared total income of Rs. 87.63 crores. NCP a declared total income of Rs. 26.56 crores, CPI, Rs. 1.07 crores and CPM declared a total income of Rs. 126.09 crores for FY 2012-13.




Chart: Total income of national political parties [FY 2012-13]

- The total income for the regional parties of Chhattisgarh is Rs 146.09 crores. SP declared the highest income of Rs 146.09 crores.
- RTI responses are awaited for the IT Returns of SHS, JDU, LJP and NPP.

IV. Number of donors contributing above Rs. 20,000 to political parties (FY 2012-13):

- The total amount of donations received above Rs. 20,000 by political parties of Chhattisgarh during FY 2012-13 is calculated from the donations report submitted to the Election Commission annually.
- The total donations above Rs 20,000 declared were Rs. 99.14 crores, from 3777 donors.
- BSP declared that the party received no donations above Rs 20,000 during FY 2012-13.




Chart: Total number of donors from all over India donating above Rs 20,000 to national political parties in FY 2012-13

Parties received a sum of Rs 1.01 lakhs from donors in Chhattisgarh. While BJP received Rs 0.51 lakhs from 1 donor, CPI received Rs 0.27 lakhs from 1 donor based in Chhattisgarh. INC received Rs 0.23 lakhs from 1 donor.





NCP, CPM, SP and SHS received no donations from Chhattisgarh.

V. <u>Sector-wise donations:</u>

- Individual donations were the only form of donations received by political parties from Chhattisgarh.
- All three political parties which received donations from Chhattisgarh INC, BJP and CPI received only
 individual donations.

VI. Donors who have not declared details of PAN:

- A total of 2 out of 3 donors (or 66.66%) contributing Rs 0.5 lakhs to the political parties have not declared their PAN details in the contribution form.
- 1 donor donating Rs. 0.27 lakhs to CPI and 1 donor donating 0.23 lakhs to INC have not revealed their PAN details.

Recommendations of ADR

- The Supreme Court gave a judgment on September 13, 2013 declaring that no part of a candidate's affidavit should be left blank. Similarly, no part of the Form 24A submitted by political parties providing details of donations above Rs 20,000 should be blank.
- Full details of all donors should be made available for public scrutiny under the RTI. Some countries where this is done include Bhutan, Nepal, Germany, France, Italy, Brazil, Bulgaria, the US and Japan. In none of these countries is it possible for 75% of the source of funds to be unknown, but at present it is so in India.
- Details of donors who make **donations to the Electoral Trusts should be available in the public domain** for increasing transparency in funding of political parties.
- Any party which does not submit its donation statement to the ECI on or before 31st Oct should be heavily
 penalized and its income should not be tax-exempted. Strict action must also be taken against parties which do
 not file their IT returns.
- IT Returns of those parties not following the ICAI guidelines for auditing of reports should be scrutinized by the IT department.
- The National and regional political parties must provide all information of their finances under the Right to Information Act. This will strengthen political parties, elections and democracy.





Detailed Report

Political parties represent citizens of the country at various levels of the government, voice people's demands and concerns to the administrative and legislative machinery, and therefore serve as a link between citizens and the government.

Apart from collecting donations / voluntary contributions, it is seen from the IT Returns of political parties that a few parties are collecting funds by issuing coupons in lieu of receipts to donors for cash contributions. Being cash donations, it is difficult to establish the identity of the donor. It is possible that a lot of cash donations received, remain unaccounted for in the books of accounts as only those amounts would be recorded for which a receipt has been issued. Thus, it is imperative to have a strict regulatory mechanism wherein political parties have to report the correct quantum and the source of donations received.

By filing RTI applications, Association for Democratic Reforms (ADR) had obtained copies of the IT Returns and Assessment Orders of the National Parties and has analyzed the income and expenditure incurred during the Financial Year 2012-13.

Total income of political parties during FY 2012-13

- The income of political parties during FY 2012-13 is calculated from their IT returns filed annually with the Income Tax Department.
- The total income of INC was Rs 425 crores while that of BJP was Rs 324 crores in FY 2012-13.
- The least annual income was declared by CPI (Rs 1 crore) followed by NCP (Rs 26 crores) and BSP (Rs 87 crores).
- SP declared the highest income of Rs 146.09 crores for a regional party.
- IT Returns of SHS, JDU, LJP and NPP are awaited. RTIs have been filed for all the aforementioned parties.

Top sources of income of political parties between during FY 2012-13

- From the table below, it can be noted that there is neither standardization nor consistency in the parties' declaration of their sources of funds.
- Of the major sources of income, sale of coupons has been listed by most of the major political parties. Income for INC from the sale of coupons/publication amounted to Rs 312.24 crores (73.35% of total income) while NCP received Rs. 3.76 crores from the sale of coupons (14.16% of total income).
- Voluntary contributions and donations have been listed as the next major source of income by the National Parties. Bahujan Samaj Party declared that it did not receive any donations above Rs 20,000 during FY 2012-13, though the party's total income declared in its ITR was Rs 87.63 crores. 83.76% of BJP's income is declared to be from donations.
- Voluntary contributions and donations also formed the topmost source of income for SP 83.11% of its total income (Rs 121.41 crores).




Chart: Top source of income for political parties of Chhattisgarh (FY 2012-13)





Top items of expenditure of National Parties during FY 2012-13

- The maximum expenditure for INC has been towards administrative and general expenses (Rs 206.99 crores) followed by election expenditure (Rs 89.95 crores). The maximum expenditure of BJP has been towards advertisement & publicity (Rs 131.87 crores) followed by travelling (Rs 36.62 crores).
- Expense towards tours and travel (Rs 1.75 crores) is the top item of expenditure for BSP during FY 2012-13.
- SP spent Rs 4.10 crores (34.5%) on advertisement.

Analysis of Voluntary Contributions Received by Political Parties

Political parties rely heavily on donations for contesting elections and running their daily affairs. They receive huge sums of money in the form of donations and contributions from corporate, trusts and individuals. Section 29C of the Representation of People Act, 1951 states that political parties submit details of contribution received in excess of Rs 20,000 from any person or a company to the ECI annually.

Named contributions seem to be very small i.e. single contributions above Rs. 20,000 seem to be very few in numbers for all the parties when compared with the total income of the party as declared in their IT Returns. While only 2.75% of total income of INC came from donations above Rs 20,000, BJP declared 25.66% of its total income from known sources of funding.

Total number of named donors who contributed to political parties from Chhattisgarh

The number of named donors to political parties from Madhya Pradesh (i.e. contributors who made donations above Rs. 20,000 which is to be mandatorily declared by political parties in their donations report) is remarkably low (only 9.66% of total income of the political parties).

(If a donor has made multiple contributions during FY 2012-13, each contribution has been individually counted. Hence, if a donor has donated twice, the number of contributors would be counted as 2).

Sector-wise donations to political parties from Chhattisgarh (FY 2012-13)

- The only three parties which received donations from Chhattisgarh are INC, BJP and CPI.
- Individual donations were the only form of donations received by political parties from Chhattisgarh.

Party-wise donations without declaration of PAN details

- Of the three political parties which received donations from donors based in Chhattisgarh, INC and CPI's
 donors have not revealed details of their PAN in their contribution form.
- INC has 1 donor donating Rs 0.23 lakhs and CPI has 1 donor donating Rs 0.27 lakhs without PAN details.

Conclusion

The **procedures and reporting framework** must be **standardized** to ensure that a true picture of the financial position of political parties is revealed to the general public. **Institute of Chartered Accounts of India (ICAI)** has put forward a set of recommendations on the request of the Election Commission of India (ECI). These recommendations relate to a standardized and **comprehensive reporting framework of financial statements of political parties**. ADR feels that there is a dire need for these recommendations to be implemented at the earliest.
