The details of proceeding and questions asked in the Meghalaya Legislative Assembly have not been updated after 2006 on the official website of the Meghalaya Legislative Assembly. Association for Democratic Reforms (ADR) and Meghalaya Election Watch (MEW) had filed RTI applications with the Meghalaya Assembly Secretariat asking for the information pertaining to the performance of the sitting MLAs and the current Legislative Assembly (2013-till date). This report has been generated from the responses received covering the period from 2013 to December 2017.

Analysis of Number of Sittings and Disruptions Occurred in Each Session of Meghalaya Legislative Assembly

- ❖ There were 12 sessions in the Meghalaya Legislative Assembly (2013-2017).
- The Legislative Assemblies have been meeting for a very short time despite legislation being the main task of the MLAs. On an average, Meghalaya State Assembly sat for 19 days per year.
- ❖ It sat for 96 days from 2013 to 2017.
- The longest sessions were the budget sessions for 2013 and 2017(2nd and 11th session). Both sessions sat for 15 days each.




Figure: Number of Sittings per Session

- On an average a session of the Meghalaya legislative assembly was disrupted for 14 times.








Figure: Number of Disruptions per Session

❖ There are 20 (32%) MLAs who have asked total 1012 questions in the Assembly sessions.








Figure: Party Wise Average Number of Questions Asked

During present assembly, 51 bills were introduced and passed.




Figure: Analysis of Bills Passed in Meghalaya Legislative Assembly
