Executive Summary

- Political parties are required to submit a statement of election expenditure to the Election Commission within 90 days of completion of General Elections and 75 days of completion of State Assembly elections.
- The expenditure statement contains details of the total amount received as funds in the form of cash, cheques and demand drafts and the total amount spent under various heads.
- The expenditure statement contains information on the amount spent on the following heads at the Central Headquarters and State Unit level by the party:
 - o Publicity
 - Travel expenses
 - Other expenses
 - Expenditure towards candidates
- Political parties submit these statements providing information of funds collected and spent between announcement and completion of elections. This period could be between 3 weeks to 3 months based on the notification issued by the Election Commission.
- The focus of this report is the expenditure of National and Regional parties during Lok Sabha 2019 elections (and the Assembly elections to four states Andhra Pradesh, Arunachal Pradesh, Odisha & Sikkim) and analyses the funds received and expenditure incurred by Parties, during the **election period of 75 days** (10-03-2019 to 23-05-2019).
- 7 National Parties and 25 Regional Parties have been considered for analysis in this report.
- Election expenditure statements of **18** Regional parties including DMDK, JD(S), RJD, JKNPP, RLD etc. are unavailable on the website of ECI. The expenditure statements of **IUML** and **SHS** are not available for the Andhra Pradesh Assembly elections 2019.

Details provided in the Election Expenditure Statement

- 25th August, 2019 was the last date of filing of election expenditure statements for National and Regional parties for the Lok Sabha elections, which was 90 days from 27th May'19, the date of completion of the elections.
- Based on the information available on the website of Election Commission of India, the expenditure statements of **15** National and Regional political parties were available in the public domain after a delay ranging between **one day to 163 days**.
- Among National Parties, BJP's expenditure statement was available after maximum delay of 85 days followed by INC (66 days), CPI (50 days), CPM (21 days) and NCP (1 day).
- It is to be noted that only BJP and CPM submitted their expenditure statements with details of only Lok Sabha elections 2019 while the election expenditure statements of INC, BSP, AITC, NCP and CPI included details of elections to Arunachal Pradesh, Andhra Pradesh, Sikkim and Odisha assemblies. In case of Regional parties, barring YSRCP, TDP, SHS, BJD, SP, IUML & SDF, all other parties submitted their expenditure details separately for the Parliamentary elections and the four State Assembly elections. As the details were not segregated by these parties, the information is taken as is submitted by the parties.


Funds collected and Expenditure incurred by political parties

- Total funds collected by **7** National and **25** Regional political parties (henceforth political parties) during General Elections 2019 amounted to a total of **Rs 6405.59 cr**.
- Of the total funds collected, National parties collected Rs 5544.34 cr (86.55%) while Regional parties received Rs 861.25 cr (13.45%).






- The **32 National and Regional parties** together **spent Rs 2591.39 cr** during the General Elections 2019, of which an expenditure **of Rs 2004.99 cr (77.37%)** was incurred by the 7 National Parties.
- AIFB and INLD are the only two parties among those analysed that declared no funds collected
 while AIFB and AIMIM are the only two parties that incurred no expenditure despite contesting
 elections.



Expenditure incurred by political parties under various heads

- Political parties declare their expenditure under the heads of Publicity, Travel Expenses,
 Other/Miscellaneous expenses and Lumpsum amounts paid to their contesting candidates.
- 32 Political parties whose expenditure details were analysed for the 2019 General Elections, spent the highest, Rs 1495.41 cr on Publicity, followed by Rs 567.19 cr on Travel expenses, Rs 528.94 cr on Lumpsum amounts paid to candidates and Rs 399.03 cr on Other/Miscellaneous expenses. (Refer to Annexure I)
- Expenditure on Publicity is **49.94%** of the overall expenditure declared under various heads while expenses incurred towards candidates constituted **17.67%** of the total expenditure.
- Political parties also spent **Rs 3.59 cr (0.12%)** on publishing criminal antecedents of their contesting candidates.
- AIFB is the only party that declared no expenses incurred under the various heads.









Expenditure on Publicity by political parties

- Political Parties are required to segregate their publicity expenses under three heads: Media
 Advertisement, Publicity Materials and Public Meetings.
- During the General Elections 2019, the 32 political parties analysed spent the maximum on Media Advertisement (Rs 1166.15 cr or 77.98%) followed by expenditure on Publicity Materials (Rs 222.1 cr or 14.85%) and Public Meetings (Rs 107.16 cr or 7.17%).
- Of the total expenditure of the 32 political parties on publicity, **Rs 1223.71 cr** or **81.83%** was spent by the **National parties** and **Rs 271.70 cr** or **18.17%** was spent by the **Regional parties**.



Expenditure on Travel by political parties

- The 'Travel' head is segregated into **travel expenses incurred specifically on star campaigners** and that of the **party leaders.**
- Political parties spent a total of Rs 567.19 cr on 'Travel'. Of this, National parties spent Rs 487.33 cr (85.92 %) and Regional Parties incurred Rs 79.86 cr (14.08%).
- National and Regional political parties collectively spent 98.53% of their total travel expenses or Rs 558.88 cr on their star campaigners and the remaining 1.47% or Rs 8.31 cr on the travel of their party leaders.







Observations of ADR

- The election expenditure statements of 18 Regional parties including DMDK, JD(S), RJD, JKNPP, RLD etc. for the 2019 Lok Sabha elections are unavailable on the website of ECI till date. The expenditure statements of IUML and SHS are not available for the Andhra Pradesh Assembly elections 2019.
- 3 Regional Parties namely **MGP**, **MPC** and **MNS** submitted their election expenditure statements for the general elections despite not having contested the elections as declared by them. The expenditure details of these parties have not been considered in this report.
- A total of **621 Unrecognised political parties** contested in the general elections last year, whose expenditure statements have not been analysed as part of this report.
- It must be noted that several political parties submitted a **combined account of their expenses for the 2019 Parliamentary elections and the four State Assembly elections** that took place alongside. This is not as per the accepted practice of submission of expenditure statements for the two types of elections in accordance with their respective deadlines of 75 days (Assembly elections) and 90 days (Lok Sabha elections). Additionally, the availability of data in such format makes it impossible to do a comparative analysis of the election expenditure over the years, which is vital from the point of view of uniformity, transparency and independent research.
- The EC issued instructions that candidates and political parties shall include all expenditure on campaigning inclusive of expenditure on advertisements on social media, both for maintaining a correct account of expenditure and for submitting the statement of expenditure. However, several parties fail to account social media expenses independent of expenses under other heads part of electronic media.

Recommendations of ADR

- Recently, nine working groups (comprising of Chief Electoral Officers of states and other ECI officials) presented their draft recommendations to the ECI, among which it was suggested that there needs to be a cap on the expenditure to be incurred for an election by political parties. In 2015, ECI also recommended to Ministry of Law, a proposal to cap maximum expenditure of political parties to a multiple of half of maximum prescribed limit for individual candidates with the number of candidates fielded. ADR recommends that steps must be taken in this regard and the modalities must be worked out in a time bound manner.
- It must be made mandatory for all political parties to submit their statements of expenditure in the format given by the ECI, within the prescribed time limit. Political parties not submitting on time or in the prescribed format should be heavily penalized.
- The **details of all donors** who contribute to National and Regional parties exclusively for their election campaigns must be declared in the public domain irrespective of the amount donated.
- A format similar to the donations report along with the date of donations, submitted to the ECI on an annual basis, has to be prescribed for the expenditure statement so as to bring in more transparency in the finances of the political parties especially during elections when it is said that black money plays a major role.
- Where possible, **expenditure must be limited to transactions via cheque/DD/RTGS** so as to reduce use of black money in elections, as per the transparency guidelines issued by the ECI.
- Similar to the shadow observers of the ECI for monitoring expenditure of candidates, there must also be observers for monitoring the expenditure of political parties.






Detailed Report

Total Funds Collected – mode-wise and party-wise


- During the Lok Sabha 2019 elections, political parties collected total funds of **Rs 6405.59 cr**. These were collected by cash, cheque/DD and in kind/bank interest.
- Of the total funds collected, National parties collected Rs 5544.34 cr (86.55%) while Regional parties received Rs 861.25 cr (13.45%).
- Political parties collected **97.72**% or **Rs 6259.44 cr** of the funds by cheque/DD followed by funds of **Rs 139.285 cr** or **2.17**% by cash and **Rs 6.86 cr** or **0.11**% in kind or bank interest.
- National Parties collected Rs 5409.624 cr while Regional parties collected Rs 849.82 cr by cheque/DD.
- The National parties collected **Rs 134.705 cr** and the Regional parties collected **Rs 4.58 cr** by cash.



- Among all the 32 political parties analysed, **BJP** collected the maximum funds of **Rs 4057.40 cr** or **63.34%** of the total funds collected by political parties during the 2019 General Elections.
- The second highest funds were collected by **INC** of **Rs 1167.14** cr (18.22%) followed by **YSRCP** which collected **Rs 221.58** cr (3.46%), **AITC** which collected **Rs 141.09** cr (2.20%) and **TDP** with **Rs 131.33** cr (2.05%).
- Other remaining parties (comprising of 4 National and 23 Regional parties) collectively received Rs 687.052 cr (10.73%).
- AIFB and INLD are the only two parties among those analysed that declared no funds collected despite contesting elections.









Total Expenditure Incurred – mode-wise and party-wise


- During the Lok Sabha 2019 elections, political parties spent a total of **Rs 2591.39 cr**. These expenses were incurred by cash and cheque/DD, and the amount remaining unpaid.
- Of the total expenditure incurred, National parties spent Rs 2004.99 cr (77.37%) while Regional parties spent Rs 586.40 cr (22.63%).
- Political parties spent 88% or Rs 2280.465 cr of the funds by cheque/DD followed by funds of Rs 238.88 cr or 9.22% remaining unpaid and Rs 72.046 cr or 2.78% by cash.
- National Parties spent **Rs 1774.475** cr while Regional parties spent **Rs 505.99** cr by cheque/DD.
- The National parties spent **Rs 64.686 cr** and the Regional parties spent **Rs 7.36 cr** by cash.



- Among all the 32 political parties analysed, **BJP** incurred the highest expenses of **Rs 1141.72 cr** or **44.06**% of the total expenditure incurred by political parties during the 2019 General Elections.
- INC incurred the second highest expenses of Rs 626.36 cr (24.17%) followed by BJD which spent Rs 193.73 cr (7.48%), YSRCP which spent Rs 85.65 cr (3.31%) and DMK with Rs 79.26 cr (3.05%).
- Other remaining parties (comprising of 5 National and 22 Regional parties) collectively spent **Rs** 464.67 cr (17.93%).
- AIFB and AIMIM are the only two parties that incurred no expenditure despite contesting elections.












Party-wise Expenditure Incurred under various heads

- Political parties spent a total of Rs 2994.16 cr on publicity, travel, miscellaneous expenses, lumpsum amount to candidates and publication of criminal antecedents of the candidates. (Refer to Annexure – I)
- The parties spent the highest on **Publicity**, **Rs 1495.41 cr** or 49.94% of the total followed by **Rs 567.19 cr** or 18.94% of total on **Travel** and **Rs 528.94 cr** or 17.67% of total on **Lumpsum amounts paid to candidates**.
- The top 3 parties which spent the highest are: **BJP** (Rs 1371.82 cr) followed by **INC** (Rs 820.887 cr) and **BJD** (Rs 193.735 cr).
- BJP incurred the maximum expenditure, Rs 651.64 cr under Publicity, which forms 43.58% of the total expenditure incurred by all political parties on Publicity. INC spent the second highest on publicity, Rs 476.83 cr or 31.89% of total.




BJP spent the highest, Rs 215.12 cr (40.67%) under Lumpsum amounts paid to candidates followed by INC which spent Rs 193.97 cr (36.67%), BJD with Rs 33.71 cr (6.37%), DMK with Rs 17.15 cr (3.24%) and CPI with Rs 13.63 cr (2.58%).








- Political parties spent a total of Rs 399.03 cr on other/miscellaneous expenses. National
 parties spent Rs 273.34 cr while Regional parties constitute Rs 125.69 cr of the total
 other/miscellaneous expenses.
- BJP spent Rs 246.28 cr or 61.72% of the total followed by BJD which spent Rs 45.03 cr (11.28%) and YSRCP which incurred expenses worth Rs 38.418 cr (9.63%) on other/miscellaneous expenses.



Party-wise Expenditure Incurred under Publicity

- Political parties spent a total of Rs 1495.41 cr on Publicity during the Lok Sabha elections 2019.
 Of this, National parties spent Rs 1223.71 cr (81.83%) while Regional parties spent Rs 271.70 cr (18.17%).
- Under Publicity, the political parties analysed spent the maximum on Media Advertisement (Rs 1166.15 cr or 77.98%) followed by expenditure on Publicity Materials (Rs 222.1 cr or 14.85%) and Public Meetings (Rs 107.16 cr or 7.17%).
- BJP spent the highest on Media Advertisement, Rs 488.333 cr or 41.88% of total followed by INC, Rs 411.939 cr or 35.32% and BJD which spent Rs 71.269 cr (6.11%).
- **Four** political parties namely, **AIFB, AIMIM, MNF** & **NPF** declared that they did not incur any expenditure under publicity despite contesting elections.


Party-wise Expenditure Incurred under Travel

- Political parties spent a total of Rs 567.19 cr on Travel during the Lok Sabha elections 2019.
 Of this, National parties spent Rs 487.33 cr (85.92%) while Regional parties spent Rs 79.86 cr (14.08%).
- Under travel expenses, the political parties analysed spent maximum on travel expenses of star campaigners (Rs 558.88 cr or 98.53%) followed by expenditure on travel of party leaders (Rs 8.31 cr or 1.47%).





- BJP spent the highest on travel of star campaigners, Rs 253.49 cr or 45.36% of total followed by INC, Rs 127.1 cr or 22.74% and AITC which spent Rs 50.726 cr (9.08%).
- Maximum expenses on travel of party leaders were incurred by BJP (Rs 4.508 cr) followed by CPM, which incurred Rs 1.114 cr.
- **Six** political parties namely, **AIFB**, **AIMIM**, **AGP**, **INLD**, **LJP** & **PMK** declared that they did not incur any expenditure under travel despite contesting elections.
